1 Enrolled, An Act,

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- To amend Section 16-28-4, Code of Alabama 1975, 3 relating to the minimum age for attendance at public schools; 4 5 to require a child to complete kindergarten or demonstrate first grade readiness before entering the first grade; to 6 7 provide for circumstances under which a child who is under 8 five years of age on September 1 may be admitted to public kindergarten; to provide for circumstances under which a child 9 10 who is under six years of age on December 31 may be admitted 11 to public school first grade; and in connection therewith 12 would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new 13 or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. 14
- 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- Section 1. Section 16-28-4 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:
- 18 "\$16-28-4

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(a) A child who is—six five years of age on or before December 31 September 1 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district shall be entitled to admission to—the first grade kindergarten in the public elementary schools at the opening of—such schools for that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter. A child who is under six years of age on December 31 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district shall not be entitled to admission to the first grade in the public elementary schools during that school year; except, that an underage child who transfers from



29	the first grade of a school in another state may be admitted
30	to school upon approval of the board of education in
31	authority, and an underage child who has moved into this state
32	having completed or graduated from a mandated kindergarten
33	program in another state shall be entitled to admission to the
34	public elementary schools regardless of age. A child who
35	becomes six years of age on or before February 1 may, on
36	approval of the local board of education, be admitted at the
37	beginning of the second semester of that school year to
38	schools in school systems having semiannual promotions of
39	pupils.
40	(b) An underage child may be admitted to public
41	kindergarten on approval of the local board of education, on a
42	space available basis, in either of the following
43	circumstances:
44	(1) The underage child transfers from a public
45	kindergarten in another state.
46	(2) The child will become five years of age between
47	September 1 and December 31, and the child satisfies certain
48	criteria that the local board of education may establish for
49	underage enrollment which, if adopted, shall include the
50	successful completion of an assessment to determine
51	developmental readiness for enrollment as provided in
52	subsection (g).
53	(b)(c) A child who is five years of age on or before
54	September 1 or successfully completes kindergarten by the date
55	on which school begins in the enrolling district shall be
56	entitled to admission to the first grade in the local public



school kindergartens at the opening of such schools for that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter; a child who is under five years of age on September 1 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district shall not be entitled to admission to such schools during that school year; except that, an underage child who transfers from the public school kindergarten in another state may be admitted to local public kindergarten on the prior approval of the local board of education on a space available basis. The aforementioned underage children transferring from the public school kindergartens of another state, upon successful completion of the kindergarten in the local public schools, will then be allowed admission to the first grade of the local public schools.

December 31, or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district, and who has not successfully completed kindergarten, shall be entitled to admission to the first grade in the local public school at the opening of schools for that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter, as long as the child demonstrates first grade entry readiness, as determined by the State Board of Education, on an assessment of essential development and physical skills as provided in subsection (g), which shall be created by the State Department of Education and approved by the State Board of Education. The department shall publish information about essential first grade readiness skills on its website. If a child does not meet first grade readiness, as determined on the assessment

86	subsection (g), the child shall be enrolled in kindergarten.				
87	(e) An underage child, regardless of whether he or she				
88	has successfully completed kindergarten or otherwise				
89	demonstrates first grade readiness, may be admitted to the				
90	public school first grade if the underage child transfers from				
91	the first grade of a school in another state.				
92	(f) Nothing in this section shall affect the				
93	eligibility of students for special education services as				
94	provided by federal and state law.				
95	(g)(1)For the 2025-2026 school year, a student entering				
96	first grade who has not completed kindergarten shall complete				
97	the assessment at the beginning of the school year to				
98	determine developmental readiness for enrollment. For this				
99	initial year assessments, no student shall be prevented from				
100	enrollment in the first grade based on his or her performance				
101	on the assessment. During the second semester of the				
102	first-grade year, students shall take an early years				
103	assessment to identify any areas of deficiencies. Programs,				
104	resources, and materials shall be made available to those				
105	students who perform below standards on the assessment.				
106	(2) For the 2026-2027 school year, a student entering				
107	first grade who has not completed kindergarten shall complete				
108	the assessment at the beginning of the school year to				
109	determine developmental readiness for enrollment. During the				
110	second semester of the first-grade year, students shall take				
111	an early years assessment to identify any areas of				
112	deficiencies. Programs, resources, and materials shall be made				






- available to those students who perform below standards of assessment.
- 115 (c) (h) No public school system shall lose any teacher

 116 unit as a result of this section. The State Board of Education

 117 is authorized to adopt policies for local boards of education

 118 for the implementation of this section."
- develop an informational campaign to promote kindergarten and encourage parents of school-age students to enroll their children in a kindergarten program. The campaign shall be targeted, and priority shall be given to areas with the largest number of students currently not enrolled in kindergarten programs.
- Section 3. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 126 127 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 128 129 Alabama of 2022. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it 130 will not become effective with regard to a local board of 131 education unless approved by the local board of education or 132 until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds 133 or provides for a local source of revenue.
- Section 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
