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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, a registered voter may only
6	vote by absentee ballot if he or she meets one of the
7	criteria prescribed by law for voting absentee.
8	This bill would allow a registered voter to vote
9	by absentee ballot without an excuse.

13	TO BE ENTITLED
14	AN ACT
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16	Relating to voting; to amend Sections 17-11-3 and
17	17-11-7, Code of Alabama 1975; to authorize absentee voting
18	without an excuse.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Sections 17-11-3 and 17-11-7, Code of
21	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
22	"§17-11-3
23	(a) Any qualified elector of this state may apply for
24	and vote an absentee ballot by mail, by hand delivery in
25	<pre>person, or by commercial carrier, as determined by rule by the</pre>
26	Secretary of State, as <u>further</u> provided in <u>Sections 17-11-5</u>
27	and 17-11-9 this chapter, in any primary, general, special, or

municipal election, if he or she makes application

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29	submits an absentee ballot application. and meets one or more
30	of the following requirements:
31	(1) The person expects to be out of the county or the
32	state, or the municipality for municipal elections, on
33	election day.
34	(2) The person has any physical illness or infirmity
35	which prevents his or her attendance at the polls, whether he
36	or she is within or without the county on the day of the
37	election.
38	(3) The person expects to work a shift which has at
39	least 10 hours which coincide with the hours the polls are
40	open at his or her regular polling place.
41	(4) The person is enrolled as a student at an
42	educational institution located outside the county of his or
43	her personal residence, attendance at which prevents his or
44	her attendance at the polls.
45	(5) The person is a member of, or spouse or dependent
46	of a member of, the Armed Forces of the United States or is
47	similarly qualified to vote absentee pursuant to the federal
48	Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 52 U.S.C.
49	\$\$ 20301-20311.
50	(6) The person has been appointed as an election
51	officer or named as a poll watcher at a polling place other
52	than his or her regular polling place.
53	(7) The person is a caregiver for a family member to
54	the second degree of kinship by affinity or consanguinity and
55	the family member is confined to his or her home.
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57 has not been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude,
58 as provided in Section 17-3-30.1.

- (b) Applications returned by mail must be received not less than seven days prior to the election. Applications returned by hand must be received not less than five days prior to the election.
- (c) An applicant for an absentee ballot who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, including the Alabama National Guard, the United States Naval Reserves, the United States Air Force Reserves, and the United States Army Reserve on active duty or active duty for training or an applicant who is the spouse of any member of the armed forces or any other applicant qualified to vote absentee pursuant to the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 52 U.S.C. §§ 20301-20311, may make application for an absentee ballot by filling out the federal postcard application form, authorized and provided for under the provisions of The Federal Voting Assistance Act of 1955, Public Law 296, Chapter 656, H.R. 4048, approved August 9, 1955, 84th Congress 1st Session.
 - (d) Any registered elector who requires emergency treatment of a licensed physician within five days of an election may apply for an emergency absentee ballot for the election and may vote by returning the absentee ballot no later than noon on the day the election is held. The attendant physician shall describe and certify the circumstances as constituting an emergency on a special form designed by the Secretary of State and provided by his or her office to local



- absentee election managers. The special form shall be attached to the application.
- (e) (1) Any registered elector whose name appears on the poll list of qualified voters may vote by an emergency absentee ballot if any of the following situations arise:

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- a. The elector is required by his or her employer under unforeseen circumstances within five days before an election to be unavailable to vote at the polls on election day.
- 93 b. The elector is a caregiver of a person who requires 94 emergency treatment by a licensed physician within five days 95 before an election.
- 96 c. A family member to the second degree of kinship by
 97 affinity or consanguinity of an elector dies within five days
 98 before an election.
- 99 (2) Under such circumstances, the elector shall apply for an emergency absentee ballot at the office of the absentee 100 101 election manager no later than the close of the business day 102 one day prior to the election. The applicant shall complete 103 and file an application form designed by the Secretary of 104 State for emergency absentee voters. The form shall contain an 105 affidavit which the applicant shall sign or swear 106 acknowledging that he or she was not aware of the situation 107 constituting the emergency prior to five days before the 108 election. An applicant who meets the requirements of this 109 subsection may vote by an emergency absentee ballot. After voting the ballot, the voter shall hand the ballot to the 110 absentee election manager. 111
 - (f) If the occurrence of a state of emergency as



declared in this or any other state, or by the federal government, renders substantial compliance with this article impossible or unreasonable for a group of qualified voters who respond to the emergency, the Secretary of State, pursuant to Section 41-22-5, may adopt an emergency rule to allow those qualified voters to vote by absentee ballot. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all expenses and costs incurred by the state or any county in carrying out the responsibilities and duties included in an emergency rule adopted pursuant to this subsection shall be paid by the State of Alabama from any funds made available for election expenses under state and federal law.

- applicable law, in the event more than one absentee ballot is cast in the name of the single voter, whether any multiple ballot is cast by mail or otherwise, none of the affidavit envelopes containing the multiple ballots shall be opened, and none of the multiple ballots shall be counted, except in the event of an election contest, upon the order of the election contest tribunal. Upon the conclusion of an election contest or, in the event no contest is filed, upon the expiration of time for filing a contest, the multiple ballots shall be provided to the district attorney, with photocopies provided to the state Attorney General, for the investigation, prosecution, or other action as may be appropriate under applicable law."

140 (a) Each absentee ballot shall be accompanied by an

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141	envelope upon which shall be printed an affidavit.
142	(b) With respect to an absentee ballot cast pursuant to
143	Section 17-11-3, the affidavit shall read as follows:

146	I, the undersigned, do swear (or affirm) that:
147	My place of residence in Alabama is:

151	I am entitled to vote an absentee ballot because:
152	Check at least one:
153	I expect to be out of the county or the state on
154	election day.
155	I am physically incapacitated and will not be able
156	to vote in person on election day.
157	I expect to work a required workplace shift which
158	has at least 10 hours which coincide with the polling hours at
159	my regular polling place.
160	I am a student at an educational institution
161	located outside the county of my permanent residence and am
162	therefore unable to vote at my usual polling place on election
163	day.
164	I am a member of or a spouse or dependent of a
165	member of the Armed Forces of the United States or am
166	otherwise entitled to vote pursuant to the federal Uniformed
167	and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973ff.
168	- I have been appointed as an election officer at a



169	polling place which is not my regular polling place.
170	I will be out of the county on election day
171	responding to a state of emergency as declared by this state
172	or any other state, or by the federal government.
173	I am a caregiver for a family member to the second
174	degree of kinship by affinity or consanguinity and the family
175	member is confined to his or her home.
176	I am currently incarcerated in prison or jail and I
177	have not been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude.
178	I further swear (or affirm) that I have not voted nor
179	will I vote in person in the election to which this ballot
180	pertains.
181	I have marked the enclosed absentee ballot voluntarily
182	and I have read or had read to me and understand the
183	instructions accompanying this ballot and I have carefully
184	complied with such instructions.
185	Moreover, I further swear (or affirm) that all of the
186	information given above is true and correct to the best of my
187	knowledge and that I understand that by knowingly giving false
188	information so as to vote illegally by absentee ballot that I
189	shall be guilty of a misdemeanor which is punishable by a fine
190	not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or confinement in
191	the county jail for not more than six months, or both.

209	(c) Unless running unopposed, a candidate may not
210	witness or notarize any absentee ballot."
211	Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
212	1, 2024.
