1 2 3 4 SYNOPSIS: This bill makes supplemental appropriations for 5 6 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, from the 7 Education Trust Fund to various agencies and entities a 8 total amount of \$651,202,906. 9 10 A BILL 11 TO BE ENTITLED 12 AN ACT 13 14 To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year 15 ending September 30, 2024, from the Education Trust Fund to 16 various agencies and entities a total amount of \$651,202,906. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 18 Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations 19 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a 20 total of \$651,202,906 from the Education Trust Fund to the 21 following agencies and entities for the purposes specified 22 below for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024: 23 (1) To the Department of Finance, Division of Risk 24 Management, for the State Insurance Fund, \$9,000,000. 25 (2) To the State Board of Education - Local Boards of Education, \$135,008,464. Of this amount, \$13,839,874 shall be 26 used for ASIMS; \$50,000,000 shall be used for purchases of new 27 28 buses based on the current age and mileage of existing buses as

- 29 recommended by the State Superintendent of Education and 30 approved by the Governor; \$10,000,000 shall be used for Career 31 Tech O&M to expand support for CTE through the purchase of 32 equipment, consumables, and supplies; \$28,783,546 shall be used 33 for core-adoption textbooks; \$22,229,387 shall be used to fund 34 the current school nurse matrix; \$8,155,657 shall be used for 35 unanticipated Foundation Program shortfalls; and \$2,000,000 36 shall be used for Current Units to support the anticipated 37 opening of new charter schools.
- (3) To the State Department of Education for one-time 38 39 expenses, \$227,000,000. Of this amount, \$100,000,000 shall be used for school safety grants for the overall security 40 41 infrastructure of schools, including installing surveillance 42 cameras, access control systems, alarm systems, creating secure 43 entry points, and fencing to control access to the school premises. ALSDE shall develop a needs-based application to 44 45 facilitate grant awards to ensure schools demonstrating the 46 most critical security infrastructure needs are funded; 47 \$50,000,000 shall be distributed to the CHOOSE Act Fund 48 established by House Bill X/Senate Bill X of the 2024 Regular 49 Session of the Legislature or subsequent act of the Legislature 50 for the purpose of funding Education Savings Accounts; 51 \$35,000,000 shall be used for student tablet or computer 52 devices replacement through a matching grant program; 53 \$15,000,000 shall be used for summer reading camps to support 54 literacy attainment; \$17,000,000 shall be used for College and 55 Career Readiness grants to continue expansion of support for 56 activities that increase students' awareness of postsecondary

- opportunities; \$7,500,000 shall be distributed to the Teacher's Liability Trust Fund; and \$2,500,000 shall be used for Ed Farm.

- \$9,950,000. Of this amount, \$2,450,000 shall be used for the
- Talent Triad, and \$7,500,000 shall be used to support a Biotech
- 62 Workforce Center in Birmingham.
- (5) To the Alabama Department of Revenue for Education
- 64 Savings Account administration, \$1,000,000.
- (6) To the Alabama School of Healthcare Sciences in
- Demopolis for one-time expenses, \$30,000,000.
- 67 (7) To the Alabama Supercomputer Authority for next
- generation firewalls for new sites, \$700,000.
- 69 (8) To the Alabama Institute for the Deaf and Blind for
- 70 the Montgomery Regional Center relocation/expansion, \$964,931.
- 71 (9) To the Marine Environmental Science Consortium for
- 72 one-time expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of
- 73 existing facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing or

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- (14) To the University of Alabama at Huntsville for one-time expenses for increasing research capacity, deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$12,000,000.
- 93 (15) To Athens State University one-time expenses for 94 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or 95 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$4,750,000.
- 96 (16) To Auburn University for one-time expenses for 97 increasing research capacity, deferred maintenance, renovation 98 of existing facilities, or ongoing capital projects, 99 \$20,500,000.
- 100 (17) To Auburn University at Montgomery for one-time 101 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing 102 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital 103 projects, \$4,250,000.
- 104 (18) To Jacksonville State University for one-time 105 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing 106 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital 107 projects, \$11,000,000.
- 108 (19) To University of Montevallo for one-time expenses
 109 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
 110 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$7,750,000.
- 111 (20) To the University of North Alabama for one-time 112 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing

- facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$12,000,000.
- 115 (21) To the University of South Alabama for one-time 116 expenses for increasing research capacity, deferred 117 maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or ongoing

capital projects, \$20,500,000.

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- 119 (22) To Troy University for one-time expenses for
 120 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
 121 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$12,250,000.
- 122 (23) To the University of West Alabama for one-time 123 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing 124 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital 125 projects, \$10,500,000.
- 126 (24) To Tuskegee University for one-time expenses for 127 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or 128 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$5,000,000.
- (25) To the Alabama Community College System for 129 130 one-time expenses, \$50,079,511. Of this amount, \$25,000,000 131 shall be used for the Alabama Energy Infrastructure Training 132 Center at Bevill State Community College; \$3,000,000 shall be 133 used for a truck driving training track at Jefferson State 134 Community College; and \$22,079,511 shall be used for deferred 135 maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or expenses 136 associated with ongoing capital projects.
- 137 (26) To the Council on the Arts for one-time expenses 138 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or 139 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects at the 140 Shakespeare Festival, \$1,000,000.

143	establishment of a north Alabama rural dental clinic residency

145	(28) Section 3, Line 559 of Act 2023-379, the Education
146	Trust Fund Appropriations Act for the fiscal year ending
147	September 30, 2024, is hereby amended as follows:

150	Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately
151	upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or upon its
152	otherwise becoming law.
