6	TO BE ENTITLED
7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to public K-12 schools; to amend Section
10	16-28A-3, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide legislative
11	findings; to define the role of assistant principal as
12	assisting the principal with certain duties, including student
13	discipline; to require each public K-12 school to have an
14	assistant principal, if funding is available; and to provide
15	procedures for dividing the responsibility if a public K-12
16	school employs more than one assistant principal.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares:
19	(1) The role of the public K-12 principal has been
20	enhanced by the Legislature to emphasize his or her role as
21	instructional leader of the school through legislation such as
22	the Alabama Literacy Act and the Alabama Numeracy Act; and
23	(2) It is necessary to provide additional support for
24	public K-12 principals by designating the duties of the
25	assistant principal and authorizing local superintendents of
26	education to delegate those duties among assistant principals.
27	Section 2. Section 16-28A-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
28	amended to read as follows:



29	"§16-28A-3
30	(a)(1) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, the
31	role of the assistant principal at each public K-12 school
32	shall include assisting the principal with administration and
33	enforcement of board policy and all applicable laws,
34	including, but not limited to student discipline, instruction,
35	management, safety, security, and any other duties assigned
36	pursuant to subsection (b). For purposes of this section, the
37	term "assistant principal" refers to any school administrator
38	who reports directly to the principal and is charged with
39	assisting the principal in the overall administration of a
40	<u>school.</u>
41	(2) Each public K-12 school in this state shall have an
42	assistant principal, provided the funding to do so is
43	available. In the event that a public K-12 school employs more
44	than one assistant principal, the local superintendent of
45	education, or his or her designee, shall determine how to
46	divide duties among the assistant principals.
47	(b) To fully implement the provisions of this chapter,
48	the State Board of Education shall require each local board of
49	education to develop a written policy on student discipline
50	and behavior and to broadly disseminate them the policy
51	following its adoption. Copies of the student discipline and
52	behavior policy shall be given to all teachers, staff,

53 parents<u>,</u> and students."

54 Section 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 55 2024.
