6	TO BE ENTITLED
7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to the Board of Nursing; to amend Section
10	34-21-2, Code of Alabama 1975, to revise the membership of the
11	board to include a certified registered nurse anesthetist who
12	is approved to engage in advanced practice nursing; and to
13	make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update existing
14	code language to current style.
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Section 34-21-2 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
17	is amended to read as follows:
18	"\$34-21-2
19	(a) There is created the Board of Nursing, which shall
20	be composed of 13 members to be appointed and have the duties
21	and powers enumerated in this section. The <u>Governor shall</u>
22	coordinate his or her appointments to assure that the
23	membership of the board <del>_shall_be_is</del> inclusive and <del>reflect</del>
24	<u>reflects</u> the racial, gender, geographic, <u>urban/rural</u> urban,
25	<u>rural</u> , and economic diversity of the state. In order to insure
26	continuity of administration, the nine board members provided
27	for by Section 3 of Act 427, Regular Session 1975, shall
28	continue to serve to the completion of the term for which they



29 are serving. The Covernor, within 60 days of January 1, 1984, shall appoint a tenth member who shall be a licensed practical 30 nurse for a term of four years from a list of nominees 31 32 furnished him or her by the Alabama Federation of Licensed 33 Practical Nurses, Incorporated, or its successor organization. As the terms of all board members expire, their successors 34 35 shall be appointed for terms of four years each. Vacancies in 36 unexpired terms shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments are made. No member shall be appointed to more 37 than two consecutive terms of four years each. Eight Six 38 39 members of the board shall be licensed professional nurses, and one member of the board shall be a licensed professional 40 41 nurse who is approved to engage in advanced practice nursing in this state, one member of the board shall be a certified 42 43 registered nurse anesthetist who is approved to engage in advanced practice nursing in this state, four members of the 44 45 board shall be licensed practical nurses, and one member of 46 the board shall be a consumer.

47 (b) (1) The Governor shall appoint the seven members of the board who are licensed professional nurses, including the 48 49 one licensed professional nurse who is approved to engage in 50 advanced practice nursing in this state, from a list of 51 nominees who are selected by the Board of Nursing Nomination 52 Committee and furnished to the Governor by the Alabama State 53 Nurses Association, or its successor organization, and the 54 list, when furnished, shall contain at least twice the number of nominees as there are appointments to be made or vacancies 55 56 to be filled. The Alabama State Nurses Association, or its



57 successor organization, on or before December 1 of each year, 58 or at such other times time as necessary, shall furnish the Governor with a list of licensed professional nurses qualified 59 60 for appointment to the board. In the nominating and appointing process, due care shall be taken to ensure the maintenance of 61 qualified representation from the fields of nursing education, 62 63 nursing administration, clinical nursing, and advanced 64 practice nursing. 65 (2) The Governor shall appoint the one member of the board who is a certified registered nurse anesthetist who is 66 67 approved to engage in advanced practice nursing in this state from a list of at least two nominees furnished to the Governor 68 69 by the Board of Directors of the Alabama Association of Nurse Anesthetists, or its successor organization. The list of 70 71 qualified certified registered nurse anesthetists shall be furnished to the Governor on or before December 1 of each year 72 73 in which the term of office of the member or a nominee of the 74 Board of Directors of the Alabama Association of Nurse

75 Anesthetists, or its successor organization, shall expire, or 76 at such other time as necessary, for an initial appointment to 77 the board beginning January 1, 2026.

78 (2)(3) The Governor shall appoint two of the four 79 members of the board who are to be licensed practical nurses 80 from a list of nominees furnished him or her by the Board of 81 Directors of the Licensed Practical Nurses Association of 82 Alabama, or its successor organization, and the list, when 83 furnished, shall contain at least twice the number of nominees 84 for the vacancies to be filled. The Board of Directors of the



85 Licensed Practical Nurses Association of Alabama, or its 86 successor organization, on or before December 1 of each year 87 in which the term of office of a board member or a nominee of 88 the Board of Directors of the Licensed Practical Nurses Association of Alabama shall expire, or at such other time as 89 90 necessary, shall furnish the Governor with the list of 91 licensed practical nurses qualified for appointment to the 92 board.

(3) (4) The Governor shall appoint two of the four 93 members on of the board who are to be licensed practical 94 95 nurses from a list of nominees furnished him or her by the Board of Directors of the Alabama Federation of Licensed 96 97 Practical Nurses, Incorporated, or its successor organization, 98 and the list, when furnished, shall contain at least twice the 99 number of nominees for the vacancies to be filled. The Board of Directors of the Alabama Federation of Licensed Practical 100 101 Nurses, Incorporated, or its successor organization, on or 102 before December 1 of each year in which the term of office of 103 the a board member filled by the nominee of the board of 104 directors Board of Directors of the Alabama Federation of 105 Licensed Practical Nurses, Incorporated, or its successor 106 organization, shall expire, or at such other times time as 107 necessary, shall furnish the Governor with a list of licensed 108 practical nurses qualified for appointment to the board.

109 (c) The Governor may remove any member from the board 110 for neglect of duty of the board, incompetency, or 111 unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.

112 (d) Each person individual appointed to the board as a



113 licensed professional nurse shall be a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of Alabama this state, and 114 115 have all of these the following additional qualifications: 116 (1) Be a graduate of a state-approved educational 117 program for the preparation of practitioners of professional 118 nursing. 119 (2) Be a currently licensed professional nurse in 120 Alabama this state. (3) Have a minimum of five years' successful nursing 121 experience in an administrative, teaching, clinical capacity, 122 123 or advanced practice. (4) Be actively engaged in professional nursing in this 124 125 state immediately preceding and during appointment. 126 (e) Each person individual appointed to the board as a 127 licensed practical nurse shall be a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of Alabama, and have all of 128 129 these the following additional qualifications: 130 (1) Hold a diploma from an accredited high school or 131 its equivalent. 132 (2) Be a graduate of a state-approved vocational 133 educational program for the preparation of practitioners of 134 licensed practical nursing. 135 (3) Be a currently licensed practical nurse in Alabama 136 this state. (4) Have a minimum of five years' successful nursing 137 138 experience. (5) Be actively engaged in licensed practical nursing 139 140 in this state immediately preceding and during appointment.



(f) There shall be one The consumer member of the board 141 142 who is a consumer and who is may not be a member of any of the 143 health care professions. The consumer member shall be 144 appointed by the Governor effective January 1, 1998, and shall 145 serve for a term of four years. His or her successor shall be 146 appointed in a like manner at the expiration of each term or 147 upon a vacancy for the remainder of an unexpired term of office. The consumer member of the board shall have, presently 148 or formerly, shall have no direct financial interest in any 149 health care facility, profession, agency, or insurer, or be, 150 151 or have been, a health care worker. (g) There shall be two advanced practice nurse 152 positions to be filled effective January 1, 1998, in the same 153 154 manner as all other professional nurse positions. One advanced 155 practice nurse position shall be served for an initial five-year term and successors shall serve four-year terms. The 156 157 remaining member appointed to an advance practice nurse 158 position shall serve an initial four-year term and successors 159 shall serve four-year terms. 160 (h) (g) All members of the board shall enjoy immunity 161 from individual civil liability while acting within the scope of their duties as board members. 162 (i) The board shall have the following powers and 163 164 perform the following duties: It (h) The board shall meet at

165 least once a year and shall, at its organizational meeting and 166 at its annual meetings thereafter, <u>shall</u> elect from its 167 members a president, a vice president, and a secretary. <u>It The</u> 168 <u>board</u> may hold<u>such</u> other and additional meetings during any



169	year as <del>it</del> the board deems necessary for the transaction of
170	business. A majority of the board, including one officer,
171	shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
172	(j) (i) The board may do any of the following:
173	(1) Adopt and, from time to time, revise such rules,
174	not inconsistent with the law, as may be necessary to carry
175	out this chapter.
176	(2) Prescribe standards and approve curricula for
177	nursing educational programs preparing persons individuals for
178	licensure licensing under this chapter.
179	(3) Provide for surveys and evaluations of such
180	programs at such times as it the board may deem necessary.
181	(4) Approve such nursing educational programs as meet
182	that satisfy the requirements of this chapter and the board.
183	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to diminish the
184	power of the State Board of Education or <u>any</u> other
185	constitutionally or legislatively established state agencies
186	agency to govern the schools under their respective
187	jurisdictions.
188	(5) Deny or withdraw approval from educational programs
189	for failure to <u>meet satisfy</u> prescribed standards. Withdrawal

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(6) Examine, license, and renew the licenses of duly qualified applicants and require employers to submit listings of personnel covered by this chapter to the board upon request including, but not limited to, personnel practicing nursing in Alabama under a multistate license, a single state license, or

of approval shall be effected only after a hearing in



197 a multistate <u>licensure licensing</u> privilege. The board may 198 issue qualified applicants either a single state license or a 199 multistate license.

(7) Adopt and, from time to time, revise rules providing standards including, but not limited to, scope of practice for student nurse apprenticeships and the issuance of student nurse apprentice permits by the board to eligible students.

(8) Adopt and, from time to time, revise rules 205 206 providing standards including, but not limited to, scope of 207 practice for certified medication assistants and the issuance of certified medication assistant permits by the board to 208 209 eligible applicants. For purposes of this chapter, a certified 210 medication assistant is an unlicensed assistive personnel 211 individual who has successfully completed a board-approved 212 curriculum for assistance with medications, or a comparable 213 program in another state, - and who holds a valid certification 214 as a medication assistant, and who has been issued a permit pursuant to this chapter. Practice by a certified medication 215 216 assistant is limited to employment in health care or 217 educational facilities that are licensed, certified, or 218 operated by this state.

(9) Conduct investigations, hearings, and proceedings concerning alleged violations of this <u>section chapter</u> or of the rules of the board.

(10) <u>Have the power to issue Issue</u> subpoenas, compel the attendance of witnesses, and administer oaths to persons individuals giving testimony at hearings.



(11) Cause the prosecution of <u>all persons</u> any individual violating this chapter and incur<u>such</u> necessary expenses therefor.

- 228 (12) Keep a public record of all of its proceedings.
- 229 (13) Keep a register of all licensees.

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(14) Make an annual report to the Governor.

(15) Appoint and employ a qualified <u>person\_individual</u>, not subject to the state Merit System, who shall not be <u>nor</u> a member of the board, to serve as <u>the</u> executive officer and administrator and commissioner of the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact for Alabama.

(16) Define the duties and fix the compensation of the executive officer and administrator and commissioner of the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact for Alabama, with the approval of the Governor and the State Personnel Board as provided in Section 36-6-6.

(17) Employ such other persons other individuals as may be necessary to carry on the work of the board and provide for appropriate bonding of employees. Regular employees of the board shall be employed subject to the state Merit System in effect on January 1, 1966, or at the time of employment.

(18) Employ consultants, specialists, counsel, or other specially qualified <u>persons individuals</u> under contract or on a part-time basis to assist<u>it</u> the board in administering this chapter and without regard to the state Merit System<u>in effect</u> on or after January 1, 1966, and pay for the services of<u>such</u> persons those individuals.

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(19) Accept gifts and grants upon terms and conditions



253 imposed by it through official resolutions.

(20) Perform such other duties, not inconsistent with law, as required by this chapter to foster and improve nursing and, the regulation thereof of the practice of nursing, and the public health of this state.

(21) Expend funds of the board in exercising its board
 powers and duties and in administering this chapter.

- 260 (22) Determine and collect reasonable fees.
- 261 (23) Adopt standards for registered and practical262 nursing practice and for continued competency of licensees.

(24) Join organizations that develop and regulate the national nursing <u>licensure licensing</u> examinations and promote the improvement of the legal standards of the practice of nursing for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare.

268 (k) (j) The executive officer employed by the board 269 shall be a citizen of the United States, <u>a person an</u> 270 <u>individual</u> of the highest integrity, and possess<u>these all of</u> 271 the following additional qualifications:

272 (1) Be a licensed professional nurse in Alabama or
273 eligible for licensure, be licensing.

274 (2) Be a graduate of a professional nursing program 275 approved by the state in which the program was completed<sub>au</sub> 276 hold.

277 (3) Hold a master's degree, and have.

278 <u>(4) Have</u> had a varied experience in nursing, including 279 at least five years' experience in an administrative or 280 teaching capacity.



281 (1) (k) The executive officer shall be bonded for the 282 faithful performance of the duties of the office in the sum of 283 not less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), and the premium 284 of the bond shall be paid out of the funds of the board.

285 (m) (1) Each member of the board shall receive the same 286 per diem and travel allowance as is paid by law to state 287 employees for each day's attendance at the board meetings 288 incurred in the discharge of his or her duties as a board 289 member in addition to any daily compensation or allowance, if 290 any, as may be provided by the board, in such any amount as 291 may be determined by the board. Any member of the board engaged in duties under the direction of the board shall 292 293 receive the per diem and travel expenses and daily 294 compensation or allowance authorized by the board.

295 (n) (m) Nothing in this chapter shall limit the rights
296 of affected parties to appeal decisions of the board with
297 regard to rules adopted pursuant to this chapter.

298 (o) (n) Participation by the state in the compact 299 provided in Article 7 shall be subject to review and 300 evaluation by the Sunset Committee pursuant to Chapter 20 of 301 Title 41, with the first review occurring in 2024. The Sunset 302 Committee shall determine whether continued participation in 303 the compact is in the best interests of the board or the 304 licensees of the board. The Sunset Committee shall also review 305 and evaluate participation in the compact within one year 306 after the occurrence of any of the following:

307 (1) The annual assessment charged the board for308 participation in the compact exceeds one-half of one percent



309 of the gross revenue of the board for the fiscal year 310 immediately preceding the levying of the annual assessment. 311 (2) The state, the board, or members or employees of 312 the state or board are named defendants in a suit brought in 313 any court of law or equity by the Interstate Commission of 314 Nurse Licensure Compact Administrators pursuant to Article 7. 315 (3) The passage of a resolution by either house of the 316 Legislature requesting review pursuant to subsection (d) of 317 Section 41-20-3(d)." Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 318 1, 2024. 319
