4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would propose an amendment to the
6	Constitution of Alabama of 2022, relating to Baldwin
7	County, to authorize and regulate the conduct of
8	certain charitable raffles, traditional paper bingo,
9	and similar charitable games in the county.

12	A BILL
13	TO BE ENTITLED
14	AN ACT
15	
16	To propose an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama
17	of 2022, relating to Baldwin County, to authorize and regulate
18	the conduct of certain charitable raffles, traditional paper
19	bingo, and similar charitable games in the county.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution
22	of Alabama of 2022, is proposed:
23	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
24	(a) As used in this amendment, the following terms have
25	the following meanings:
26	(1) CASINO-STYLE GAME. Any commercial or house banked
27	game that is played with cards, dice, equipment, or any other
28	mechanical or electronic device or machine, and that is played



- 29 for money, property, checks, credit, or any other
- 30 representative of value. The term includes, but is not limited
- 31 to, any of the following:
- 32 a. Table games, including, but not limited to,
- 33 blackjack, baccarat, roulette, craps, twenty-one, poker, Texas
- 34 hold'em, cassino, five-card draw, three-card draw, chemin de
- 35 fer (shimmy), pai gow poker, yablon (red dog), let it ride
- 36 poker, caribbean stud, casino war, video poker, or any
- 37 variation thereof.
- 38 b. Gaming machines, including, but not limited to, any
- 39 slot machines as defined in 15 U.S.C. § 1171(a)(1), pachinko,
- 40 video lottery terminals, and video poker.
- c. Pari-mutuel wagering, whether electronic, simulcast,
- 42 or otherwise.
- d. Any other house banked game or game of chance in
- 44 which the house takes a fee, as determined by the commission
- 45 by rule.
- 46 (2) CHARITABLE GAME. A non-casino-style game, approved
- 47 by the Baldwin County Commission, that is operated by a
- 48 charitable organization for charitable fundraising purposes.
- The term includes, but is not limited to, the following
- 50 non-casino-style games: Traditional raffles, traditional paper
- 51 bingo, cake walks or musical chairs, and turkey or clay target
- 52 shoots. The term does not include any house banked game,
- 53 casino-style game, any game requiring the use of gaming
- equipment, or any wagers on animal racing or sports events.
- 55 (3) CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION. An organization to which
- 56 all of the following apply:



- a. The organization is either of the following:
- 1. Organized and operated exclusively for any of the following purposes: charitable, religious, veterans, educational, scientific, literary, public safety, or the
- 61 prevention of cruelty to children or animals.

- 2. An elementary or secondary school or nonprofit elementary or secondary school-sponsored club or organization, or any nonprofit elementary or secondary school-affiliated group, including a parent-teacher organization or booster club, whose membership may be composed of individuals other than students.
- b. None of the organization's net proceeds or earningsinure to any private shareholder or individual.
 - (4) HOUSE BANKED GAME. Any game of chance that is played with the house as a participant in the game; where the house takes on players, collects from losers, and pays winners; and where the house can win. The term also includes any game in which the house collects a percentage of what is at risk or collects a fee as a condition for participation.
 - (5) TRADITIONAL BINGO. A game in which players provide something of value to receive a prize according to the rules of the game commonly known as bingo, which includes each of the following elements: a. The game requires human interaction and skill, including attentiveness and discernment and physical, visual, auditory, and verbal interaction by and between those persons who are playing and a person, commonly known as the "announcer" or "caller," who is responsible for calling out the randomly drawn designations and allowing time



between each call for the players to check their cards and to
physically mark them accordingly. The game requires the player
to use actual physical cards made of cardboard, paper, or some
functionally similar material that is flat and is preprinted
with the grid and the designations referenced above.

- (6) TRADITIONAL RAFFLE. A means of raising money by selling numbered tickets on paper or other tangible material, one or more of which are subsequently drawn at random, the holder or holders of such tickets winning a prize.
- (b) A charitable organization desiring to conduct a charitable game for charitable purposes in Baldwin County or a municipality therein shall apply to the Baldwin County Commission or governing body of the respective municipality for a charity fundraising permit, which shall be valid for the duration of the single fundraising event described in the application.
- 101 (c) The county commission shall adopt regulations
 102 relating to the conduct, operation, and reporting requirements
 103 of permitted charitable gaming activity conducted under this
 104 amendment, including the establishment of a permit fee and the
 105 production of an application for regulating.
 - (d) A charitable organization issued a permit under this amendment shall comply with all rules adopted by the county commission.
- 109 (e) A charitable game permitted under this amendment
 110 may not be operated outside of this state or through the use
 111 of a video lottery terminal or any other mechanical,
 112 electromechanical, or other electronic device or machine that



- performs all the functions of a lottery by itself when networked with other similar devices or machines.
- (f) All charitable game ticket sales shall be limited to individuals who are physically located in this state at the time of purchase.
- 118 (g) A permit holder under this article may not do
 119 either of the following:
- 120 (1) Compensate any individual for the provision of
 121 supplies or prizes used in the operation of a charitable game,
 122 except to pay the actual fair market value of the prizes or
 123 supplies necessary for the operation of the charitable game.
- 124 (2) Provide any additional compensation to an
 125 individual who is a regular employee of the charitable
 126 organization for the individual's services in organizing or
 127 operating a charitable game.

Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the 128 129 Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as 130 appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional 131 paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: 132 change capitalization, hierarchy, spelling, and punctuation 133 for purposes of style and uniformity; correct manifest 134 grammatical, clerical, and typographical errors; revise internal or external citations and cross-references; and 135 136 translate effective dates.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284, 284.01, and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws



141	of this state. The appropriate election official shall assign
142	a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on
143	the election ballot and shall set forth the following
144	description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed
145	constitutional amendment:
146	"Relating to Baldwin County, proposing an amendment to
147	the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to authorize and regulate
148	the conduct of charitable raffles, traditional paper bingo,
149	and similar charitable games within the county.
150	Proposed by Act"
151	This description shall be followed by the following
152	language:
153	"Yes() No()."
154	Section 3. The proposed amendment shall become valid as
155	part of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, when approved by
156	a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon.
