4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, sheriffs in certain counties
6	are authorized to contract for service of process.
7	This bill would authorize all sheriffs to
8	contract for service of process.
9	Under existing law, service of process fees and
10	the disposition of those fees are provided for by local
11	law.
12	This bill would require every county to collect
13	a service of process fee, and would provide for the
14	disposition of the fee.
15	This bill would also authorize sheriffs to adopt
16	the service of process fee and fee disbursement
17	authorized by this act in lieu of the fee and fee
18	disbursement provided by local law.

32 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

33 Section 1. (a) A sheriff, except for warrants for 34 arrest, may contract with or enter into a contract or 35 agreement with a private, public, or governmental entity for 36 the purpose of service of process.

37 Section 2. (a) Unless otherwise provided by local law, 38 in addition to all existing charges, fees, judgments, and 39 costs of court, the clerk, sheriff, or other appropriate court 40 official in the district and circuit courts shall collect a 41 service of process fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per document 42 which shall be paid to the circuit clerk. The district 43 attorney shall be exempt from the service of process fee.

(b) The circuit clerk shall collect the service of 44 45 process fee and shall retain three dollars (\$3) of each fee 46 for deposit in the circuit clerk's fund for the operation of 47 the office of circuit clerk or for the compensation or 48 reimbursement of mileage incurred by jurors. The clerk shall 49 transfer three dollars (\$3) of each fee to the district 50 attorney. The remainder of the monies collected shall be 51 remitted to the sheriff.

52 (c) (1) The sheriff may use the monies generated by this
53 section for any lawful purpose relating to the operation of
54 the office of sheriff.

55 (2) The monies shall not revert to the general fund of56 the county at the end of the fiscal year.

(d) If, upon enactment of this legislation, a service
of process fee or fee disbursement has been established by
local law, the sheriff may choose to adopt the service of
process fee and fee disbursement authorized by this section in
lieu of the service of process fee and fee disbursement
provided by local law.

63 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October64 1, 2024.
