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9	Relating to motor vehicle registrations and license
10	plates; to amend Sections 32-6-157, 32-6-231, 32-6-231.1,
11	32-6-231.2, and 40-12-300, Code of Alabama 1975, to replace
12	the International Symbol of Access with the Dynamic
13	Accessibility Symbol on distinctive license plates issued to
14	individuals with disabilities.
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Sections 32-6-157, 32-6-231, 32-6-231.1,
17	32-6-231.2, and 40-12-300, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended
18	to read as follows:
19	" §32-6-157
20	Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
21	contrary, distinctive and personalized license plates may be
22	issued to trucks with gross vehicle weight not exceeding
23	10,000 pounds $_{7:}$ provided $_{\underline{\prime}}$ the provisions of this section shall
24	not apply to distinctive military license plates or plates
25	with the International Symbol of Access Dynamic Accessibility
26	Symbol."
27	" §32-6-231
28	(a) Any person individual who submits to the license



- 29 issuing official a completed special access parking or
- 30 disability access parking application form approved by the
- 31 Commissioner of Revenue which includes the physician's
- 32 certification that he or she is an individual with a
- disability shall be issued one removable windshield placard
- 34 displaying the International Symbol of Access Dynamic
- 35 Accessibility Symbol thereby designating the driver of the
- 36 vehicle or the passenger as being an individual with a
- 37 disability.
- 38 (1) The removable windshield placard shall be prepared
- 39 by the commissioner in conformity to Public Law 100-641 and
- 40 rulemaking resulting therefrom.
- 41 (2) a. The removable windshield placard issued to the
- 42 individual with a long-term disability shall expire after a
- 43 maximum period of five years or any period less than five
- 44 years to be designated by the commissioner. The placard shall

- 76 (a) For the purpose of parking spaces reserved for
- 77 persons with disabilitiesthis section, the term "military
- 78 distinctive license plate" includes any of the following:
- 79 Medal of Honor license plate; Prisoners of War license plate;
- 80 Purple Heart Medal Recipients license plate; retired military
- 81 license plate; National Guard license plate; disabled veteran
- 82 license plate; Pearl Harbor survivors license plate; World War
- 83 II veterans license plate; Korean War veterans license plate;
- veterans of the Battle of the Bulge license plate; veterans of



Desert Shield/Desert Storm license plate; Vietnam veterans
license plate; veterans of the United States Armed Forces
exposed to dangerous levels of radiation due to the atomic
bomb and weapons testing from 1944 to 1962 license plate; and
any subsequently enacted distinctive license plates issued

- (b) Any personindividual qualified to receive a military distinctive license plate pursuant to this chapter, who submits to the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other issuing official authority medical proof satisfactory to the Commissioner of Revenue that he or she is a handicapped an individual with a disability in accordance with Public Law 100-641 and rulemaking resulting therefrom, shall be issued a distinctive military license plate which is inscribed with the International Symbol of AccessDynamic Accessibility Symbol designating the vehicle owner as being a handicapped an individual with a disability. The Commissioner of Revenue shall adopt procedures for the issuance of these distinctive military license plates containing the International Symbol of Access Dynamic Accessibility Symbol. Handicapped individuals Individuals with disabilities displaying these plates shall be allowed to park in parking zones designated reserved for handicapped personsindividuals with disabilities upon the payment of parking fees the same as any other personindividual."

111 (a) Commencing on January 1, 2022, a vehicle owner who
112 is qualified to receive a distinctive license plate pursuant

- (a) (1) The distinctive license plates provided for
- 130 herein shall be prepared by the Commissioner of Revenue and
- 131 shall be issued through the county license issuing officials
- of the state in the same manner as are other motor vehicle
- 133 license plates. An applicant for such a distinctive plate
- shall present to the issuing official documentation that he or
- she is either of the following:
- a. A parent, stepparent, or legal guardian of a minor
- 137 or an adult who is an individual with a disability as defined
- 138 in Section 32-6-230.
- 139 b. An individual with a disability as defined in
- 140 Section 32-6-230.



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- (2) Upon presentation of the required documentation, the applicant shall be issued the requested number of special access or disability access distinctive license plates upon the payment of the regular license fee, as provided by law.

- (b) Any private agency, nursing home, church, or charitable institution that submits to the licensing authority proof satisfactory to the commissioner that it operates a motor vehicle for the primary purpose of transporting one or more individuals with disabilities may apply for the distinctive plates. Applicants shall pay the regular fees for license plates, as provided by law.
- (c) Any government agency that applies for a license plate for a vehicle—which that it owns for the primary purpose of transporting individuals with disabilities shall be issued the requested number of license plates according to Section 40-12-250, with the plate displaying the International Symbol of Access Dynamic Accessibility Symbol embossed on the plate.
- (d) The distinctive license plates shall be used only upon and for personally-owned, private, or government owned and operated passenger vehicles, including, but not limited to, vans, station wagons, buses, motorcycles, and pickup trucks, registered in the name of the personindividual, or public or private agency, nursing home, church, or charitable institution making application therefor, and when issued to the applicant shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plates normally issued for the vehicle. This division shall not be construed to require an individual with a disability to display a distinctive special



access or disability access license plate. It is hereby specifically provided that this division shall be construed in pari materia with Section 32-6-231. The commissioner may make any rules or regulations necessary to carry out this division.

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
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- (e) The commissioner may require all persons individuals with long-term disabilities to be recertified by a licensed physician before special access parking or disability access parking license plates may be reissued.
- (f) Notwithstanding any provision of this section, a
 motor vehicle may not be parked in an area reserved for
 handicapped parking unless the individual individuals with
 disabilities to park unless the individual with a disability
 is in the vehicle."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on January 183 1, 2026.
