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29	Section 1. (a) The State Board of Health shall not
30	prohibit an unlicensed non-emergency medical transport service
31	from transporting a patient on a stretcher, gurney, or cot,
32	provided that each of the following apply:
33	(1) The transport vehicle is designed and equipped to
3 4	hold a stretcher, gurney, or cot.
35	(2) The patient is being transported to or from a
36	medical care facility under non-emergency circumstances,
37	including transportation to and from medical appointments. For
38	the purposes of this section, a non-emergency circumstance
39	exists when the health and life of a patient is not at serious
10	risk without immediate medical treatment, such as uncontrolled
11	bleeding, a heart attack, an automobile accident, or other

13	further defining a non-emergency circumstance.
14	(b) The State Board of Health may adopt rules governing
15	the operation and conduct of non-emergency medical transport
