BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. Section 3-1-28, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:
"§3-1-28
All owners or custodians of animalswhich that die or are killed intheir his or her possession or custody, other than-such as are those slaughtered for food, within 24 hours shall-cause the bodics of such animals to be burned ox burn, buricd bury at least two feet below the surface of the ground, or otherwise dispose of the animals' bodies in accordance with

## HB297 INTRODUCED

Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries rules. Hogs dying from cholera or any other discase whatsocver shall be burned. No-such animal shall be burned-or, buried, or disposed of sufficiently near a residence-or residences as to create a nuisance. Any person individual violating this section, whether by failure to burn-or, bury, or dispose of an animal, dying or being killed in his possession or by causing the-same animal to be burned in such proximity to a-dwelling residence or in such other way as to become a nuisance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, shall be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50).00."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2024 .
