4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, volunteer firefighters are
6	eligible to receive a firefighter distinctive license
7	plate.
8	This bill would expand eligibility for the
9	firefighter distinctive license plate to include fire
10	chaplains.
11	Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of
12	2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect
13	would be to require a new or increased expenditure of
14	local funds from becoming effective with regard to a
15	local governmental entity without enactment by a $2/3$
16	vote unless: it comes within one of a number of
17	specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected
18	entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or
19	provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for
20	the purpose.
21	The purpose or effect of this bill would be to

require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the section. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the section.

34	Relating to motor vehicle registrations and license
35	plates; to amend Section 32-6-271, Code of Alabama 1975, to
36	expand eligibility for the firefighter distinctive license
37	plate to include fire chaplains; and in connection therewith
38	would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new
39	or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of
40	Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
41	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
42	Section 1. Section 32-6-271, Code of Alabama 1975, is
43	amended to read as follows:
44	"\$32-6-271
45	(a) <u>(1)</u> A firefighter, upon application and subject to
46	this division, may be issued a distinctive motor vehicle
47	license plate as identification as a firefighter. In addition
48	to the proper numbers, words, and insignias used on the
49	standard license plate issued for motor vehicles, the
50	<u>firefighter</u> distinctive <u>license</u> plates issued to firefighters
51	shall bear a red Maltese cross emblem on each side to the left
52	and right of the regular tag numbers. The words "Fire Fighter"
53	should be centered at the bottom of the license plate.
54	(2)a. A fire chaplain, who is a member of the Alabama
55	Fellowship of Fire Chaplains, upon application and subject to
56	this division, may be issued one firefighter distinctive



57 license plate.

58	b. Proof of service as a fire chaplain shall be
59	verified by an affidavit signed by the President of the
60	Alabama Fellowship of Fire Chaplains attesting that the
61	applicant is a member in good standing of that organization
62	and eligible to receive the firefighter distinctive license
63	plate. An individual who is no longer a member in good
64	standing of the Alabama Fellowship of Fire Chaplains is
65	ineligible to receive the firefighter distinctive license
66	plate.
67	(b) In addition to any other fees provided for by law,
68	an annual additional fee of one dollar (\$1.00) is added to the
69	cost of the firefighter distinctive license plate provided for
70	in this division, effective January 1, 2022. The annual
71	additional fee collected pursuant to this section shall be
72	distributed by each licensing official to the state
73	Comptroller <u>, . The state Comptrollerwho</u> shall distribute the
74	net proceeds monthly as follows:
75	(1) Fifty cents ($\$.50$) shall be deposited into a fund
76	managed by the Alabama Joint Fire Council and shall be used
77	for the purpose of expanding and maintaining the Alabama
78	Firefighter Memorial located in Tuscaloosa.
79	(2) Fifty cents ($\$.50$) shall be distributed to the
80	Alabama Joint Fire Council to be used for expenses associated
81	with the Firefighter Peer Support Program.
82	(3) Fees collected for firefighter distinctive license
83	plates issued to fire chaplains shall be distributed to the
84	Alabama Fellowship of Fire Chaplains.

85	(c) The funds generated by this fee shall be subject to
86	audit from either the Department of Examiners of Public
87	Accounts or an independent certified public accountant once
88	every three calendar years effective January 1, 2022.
89	(d) The firefighter distinctive license plates issued
90	under this section shall be used only upon and for personally
91	owned, private passenger vehicles, to include station wagons
92	and pick-up trucks, registered in the name of the applicant
93	and, when issued to the applicant, shall be used upon the
94	vehicle for which it is issued in lieu of the standard license
95	plate normally issued for the vehicle.
96	(e) Any individual who is proven to have falsely
97	obtained or falsely certified an individual to obtain a
98	firefighter distinctive license plate issued under this
99	section shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and, upon
100	conviction, shall be punished according to law.
101	(f) The Department of Revenue may adopt any rules
102	necessary to administer this section."
103	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose
104	or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of
105	local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements
106	and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
107	Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
108	amends the definition of an existing crime.
109	Section 3. This act shall become effective on January
110	1, 2025.
