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4 SYNOPSIS:

> Under existing law, the primary duty of any police officer employed by The University of Alabama System is the enforcement of the law on property owned or leased by the system.

This bill would authorize The University of Alabama System to enter into agreements with other law enforcement agencies to further provide for the authority of university police officers.

This bill would also make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

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Related to law enforcement officers; to amend Sections 16-47-11 and 36-21-49, Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the authority of The University of Alabama System police officers; to further provide for agreements between law enforcement agencies; and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

 Section 1. Sections 16-47-11 and 36-21-49, Code of

 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
- 32 **"**\$16-47-11

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- 33 (a) Any police officer appointed pursuant to the provisions of this section or Section Sections 16-47-10 or 34 35 $16-22-1_{T}$ is a peace officer whose authority extends to any 36 place in the state; provided, that the primary duty of any 37 such police or a peace officer shall be the enforcement of the law on property owned $\frac{\text{or}_{\underline{I}}}{\text{or}}$ leased, or licensed by the 38 39 institution of higher education employing said the peace officers; officer. provided further, that he shall not 40 41 otherwise act as a Such a peace officer in enforcing may also enforce the law exceptin all of the following circumstances: 42
 - offender who is charged with individual who is suspected of the commission of a crime while on the premises of said property owned, leased, or licensed by the institution; or of higher education employing the officer.
 - (2) To make arrests otherwise lawfully for crimes committed, or for which there is probable cause to believe have been committed, within his or her presence or within the boundaries of said any property owned or, leased, or licensed by the institution of higher education employing the officer.
 - (3) Pursuant to an agreement with another law enforcement agency.
 - (b) The provisions of this section granting authority to police peace officers at institutions of higher learning

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- education in the State of Alabama this state are not intended to limit or abridge any powers heretofore otherwise granted to said the officers by law, and the provisions of this section are, therefore, to be considered cumulative.
 - (c) Nothing in this section shall grant authority to any persons individual appointed under the provisions of this section Section 16-47-10 to enter a classroom for the purpose of enforcing traffic or parking citations."

Each state, county, municipal, and state college or university law enforcement agency in the this state is hereby authorized to may make agreements and arrangements for cooperation and mutual assistance in law enforcement work with the commission and with each other."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1, 2024.
