7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to state holidays; to amend Section 1-3-8,
10	Code of Alabama 1975, to add Juneteenth as a state holiday and
11	provide that state offices shall not close on Jefferson Davis'
12	birthday and Juneteenth.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	" §1-3-8
17	(a) Sunday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Martin
18	Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, Robert E. Lee's birthday, George
19	Washington's birthday, Thomas Jefferson's birthday,
20	Confederate Memorial Day, National Memorial Day, Jefferson
21	Davis' birthday, <u>Juneteenth</u> , the Fourth day of July, Labor
22	Day, Columbus Day and Fraternal Day, Veterans' Day, American
23	Indian Heritage Day, and the day designated by the Governor
24	for public thanksgiving shall each be deemed a holiday. If any
25	holiday falls on Sunday, the following day is the holiday. If
26	any holiday falls on Saturday, the preceding day is the
27	holiday. Veterans' Day shall be observed by the closing of all
28	state, county, and municipal offices, all banks located within



- 29 this state, and the public schools on such day. Public
- 30 schools, grades K to 12, inclusive, and all public two-year
- institutions of higher education shall also be closed on
- 32 National Memorial Day, and such closing shall be applicable to
- 33 all students and non-essential employees. The Superintendent
- of Banks, with the concurrence of not less than two members of
- 35 the state Banking Board, may authorize any state bank to close
- on National Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, and on such
- other days as may be declared by the Governor to be state
- 38 holidays in honor of a special event. If any authorized state
- 39 holiday falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may
- 40 authorize the Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday.
- 41 The superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at
- 42 12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day, and the day
- 43 prior to New Year's Day, if such days fall on business days.
- (b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays, the
- 45 following shall be observed on the dates herein prescribed:
- 46 (1) Robert E. Lee's birthday the third Monday in
- 47 January.
- 48 (2) George Washington's birthday the third Monday in
- 49 February.
- 50 (3) Confederate Memorial Day the fourth Monday in
- 51 April.
- 52 (4) Jefferson Davis' birthday the first Monday in
- June.
- 54 (5) Juneteenth the nineteenth day of June.

- 56 Monday in October.

- (8) (9) National Memorial Day the last Monday in May.
- 61 (9)(10) Thomas Jefferson's birthday the third Monday
- 62 in February.
- $\frac{(10)}{(11)}$ American Indian Heritage Day the second
- 64 Monday in October.
- 65 (c) In addition to the legal holidays provided above,
- 66 Mardi Gras shall be deemed a holiday in Mobile and Baldwin
- 67 Counties and all state offices shall be closed in those
- 68 counties on Mardi Gras.
- (d) In addition to the legal holidays provided above,
- 70 all state employees, except those employed in Baldwin and
- 71 Mobile Counties, shall be granted one personal leave day per
- 72 year. The personal leave day shall be granted on January 1 of
- each year. All state employees employed in Baldwin and Mobile
- 74 Counties shall be granted no personal leave day. All such
- 75 personal leave days granted in any year shall be used by the
- 76 end of the calendar year. All—such personal leave days shall
- 77 be scheduled during the year with the approval of the
- 78 supervisor. Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave
- 79 days for employees shall justify that action in writing to the
- Director of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay
- 81 at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary
- rate of pay for any personal leave day not taken by December
- 83 31 of each year.
- 84 (e)(1) All state holidays, except Jefferson Davis'



85 birthday and Juneteenth, shall be observed by the closing of 86 all state offices. Any state office may remain open on a state 87 holiday upon written notice by the appointing authority to the 88 State Personnel Board at least 60 days in advance of the 89 holiday. Provided, that any state office may be opened in the 90 event of an emergency and the State Personnel Board may grant 91 a blanket approval for the openings of state offices needing 92 to be open on holidays on a regular basis for essential 93 services. Any state employee working on a state holiday shall receive a day of compensatory leave or paid compensation in 94 95 lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

(2) Notwithstanding subdivision (1), employees shall be given the option to observe either Jefferson Davis' birthday or Juneteenth as a state holiday. Each agency shall establish a policy to implement this subdivision.

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(f) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any 100 compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly 101 102 scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the supervisor, 103 during the guarter that the regularly scheduled holiday 104 occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be scheduled 105 during the designated quarter, the compensatory leave day may 106 be accumulated at the request of the employee for up to one 107 year. Supervisors failing to schedule compensatory leave days 108 for employees within the quarter, unless the day is carried 109 forward at the request of the employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director of State Personnel and the 110 employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the 111 112 employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any



- 113 compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled 114 and which has not been taken.
- 115 (g) (1) The first day in December of each year is
- 116 designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All
- 117 citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of
- 118 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of
- 119 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love,
- and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement
- on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus
- in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is
- 123 requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.
- 124 (2) Each county and municipality may elect to observe
- 125 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."
- 126 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 127 1, 2024.
