5	Under existing federal law, Juneteenth is a

7	This bill would add Juneteenth as a state
8	holiday.
9	This bill would also delete duplicative language
10	and make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update
11	the existing code language to current style.

15	AN ACT

17	Relating to state holidays; to amend Section 1-3-8,
18	Code of Alabama 1975, to add Juneteenth as a state holiday;
19	and to delete duplicative language and make nonsubstantive,
20	technical revisions to update the existing code language to
21	current style.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
24	amended to read as follows:
25	"§1-3-8
26	(a) The following days are official state holidays:
27	Sunday, Christmas Day,
28	(1) New Year's Day, <u>January 1.</u>



29	(2) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday $_{ au}$ and Robert E.
30	Lee's birthday, the third Monday in January.
31	(3) George Washington's birthday $_{ au}$ and Thomas
32	Jefferson's birthday, <del>Confederate Memorial Day, National<u>the</u></del>
33	third Monday in February.
34	(4) Confederate Memorial Day, the fourth Monday in
35	April.
36	(5) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May. Jefferson
37	<del>Davis' birthday,</del>
38	(6) Jefferson Davis' birthday, the first Monday in
39	June.
40	(7) Juneteenth, June 19. the
41	(8) The Fourth day of July, July 4.
42	(9) Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
43	(10) Columbus Day, and Fraternal Day, and American
44	Indian Heritage Day, the second Monday in October.
45	<u>(11)</u> Veterans' Day, <u>November 11. American Indian</u>
46	Heritage Day, and the day
47	(12) Thanksgiving Day, as designated by the Governor
48	for public thanksgiving shall each be deemed a holiday.
49	(13) Christmas Day, December 25.
50	(b) If any holiday falls on Sunday, the following day
51	is the holiday. If any holiday falls on Saturday, the
52	preceding day is the holiday.
53	(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (f), all
54	state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state
55	offices. In addition, Veterans' Day shall be observed by the
56	closing of all state, county, and municipal offices, all banks



57	located within this state, and the all public $K-12$ schools, on
58	such day. Public schools, grades K to 12, inclusive, and all
59	public two-year institutions of higher education shall also be
60	closed on National Memorial Day, and such closing shall be
61	applicable to all students and non-essential employeesand
62	Memorial Day shall be observed by the closing of all public
63	K-12 schools and all public two-year and four-year
64	institutions of higher education.
65	(d) The Superintendent of Banks, with the concurrence
66	of not less than two members of the state Banking Board, may
67	authorize <del>any<u>the closure of</u> state <u>bank to close on National</u></del>
68	Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, banks in observance of
69	any state or federal holiday and on such any other days day as
70	may be declared by the Governor to be <u>a</u> state <del>holidays</del> holiday
71	or by the President of the United States to be a federal
72	holiday in honor of a special event. If any authorizeda state
73	holiday falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may
74	authorize the Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday.
75	The superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at
76	12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day, and the day
77	prior to New Year's Day, if <del>such days</del> the holidays fall on
78	business days.
79	(b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays, the
80	following shall be observed on the dates herein prescribed:
81	(1) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the third Monday in
82	January.
83	<del>(2) George Washington's birthday - the third Monday in</del>

85	(3) Confederate Memorial Day - the fourth Monday in

87	(4) Jefferson Davis' birthday - the first Monday in

92	(7) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday - the third

99	<pre>(c) (1) In addition to the legal state holidays</pre>
100	provided <u>above</u> in subsection (a), Mardi Gras shall be deemed a
101	holiday in Mobile and Baldwin Counties and all state offices
102	shall be closed in those counties on Mardi Gras.
103	(d)(2) In addition to the legal holidays provided above
104	$\frac{allAll}{all}$ state employees, exceptother than those employed in
105	Baldwin and Mobile Counties $_{m{ au}}$ shall be granted one personal
106	leave day per year. The personal leave day shall be granted on
107	January 1 of each year. All state employees employed in
108	Baldwin and Mobile Counties shall be granted no personal leave
109	day. All such personal leave days granted in any year pursuant
110	to this subdivision shall be used by the end of the calendar
111	year. All such personal leave days shall and must be scheduled
112	during the year with the approval of the supervisor.



113 Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave days for 114 employees shall justify that action in writing to the Director 115 of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay at a 116 rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of 117 pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 31 of 118 each year.

(c) (f) (1) All state holidays shall be observed by the 119 120 closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing 121 122 authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in 123 advance of the holiday. Provided, that In addition, any state office may be opened in the event of an emergency, and the 124 125 State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the 126 openings opening of state offices needing to be open on 127 holidays on a regular basis for essential services.

128 (2) Any state employee working on a state holiday shall 129 receive a day of compensatory leave or paid compensation in 130 lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

(f) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any 131 132 compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly 133 scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the his or her 134 supervisor, during the quarter that the regularly scheduled 135 holiday occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be 136 scheduled during the designated quarter, the compensatory 137 leave day may be accumulated at the request of the employee 138 for up to one year. Supervisors failing to schedule compensatory leave days for employees within the quarter, 139 140 unless the day is carried forward at the request of the



employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director of State Personnel, and the employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled and which has not been taken.

146 (g)(1) The first day in December of each year is 147 designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All 148 citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of 149 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love, 150 151 and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus 152 153 in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is 154 requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.

155 (2) Each county and municipality may elect to observe156 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."

157 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first 158 day of the third month following its passage and approval by 159 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
