Any person who uses 34 instrumentation described herein in this chapter to test or 35 question individuals for the purpose of detecting deception or 36 verifying truth of statements, or any person who holds himself 37 or herself out to be a lie detector operator or polygraph examiner, or any person who purports to be able to detect 38 39 deception or verify truth of statements through instrumentation or the use of a mechanical deviceutilizing a 40 41 polygraph instrument.
 - (6) POLYGRAPH DEVICE. An instrument that, at a minimum, records visually, permanently, and simultaneously a subject's cardiovascular pattern, respiratory pattern, and galvanic skin response. A polygraph device does not include equipment or devices used for the purpose of computer voice stress analysis."
