20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the Opioid
22	Treatment and Abatement Fund the sum of \$30,000,000 for the
23	fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, to the entities and for
24	the purposes specified herein:
25	(1) To the Department Corrections for an initiative to

(1) To the Department Corrections for an initiative to support the implementation or expansion of medication for opioid use disorders (MOUD)-Advancing Medication for Opioid Use Disorders in state prisons, \$1,000,000.

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29 (2) To the Board of Pardons and Paroles, \$5,490,000. Of 30 this amount, \$1,515,000 shall be used for substance abuse 31 disorder (SUD) treatment and services for women; \$2,300,000 32 shall be used for recovery and facility services, including 33 housing and transitional space for those suffering from 34 substance abuse disorder (SUD); \$175,000 shall be used to 35 expand prevention services; and \$1,500,000 shall be used to 36 implement a program to streamline navigation of services for

people with or affected by substance abuse disorder (SUD).

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- (3) To the Department of Mental Health, \$20,510,000. Of 38 39 this amount \$2,000,000 shall be used for Medicaid State Match; \$1,000,000 shall be used for residential detox; \$1,150,000 40 shall be used for prevention and improved outcomes; \$3,000,000 41 42 shall be used for the 988 Crisis Line; \$8,060,000 shall be 43 used for prevention, treatment, and recovery grants; \$1,300,000 shall be used for a statewide marketing campaign; 44 45 \$1,000,000 shall be used for mental health courts; and 46 \$3,000,000 shall be used for a veterans pilot programs through 47 an RFP process.
 - (4) To Auburn University for expansion of the School of Pharmacy, K-12 Education Program and Pharmacy Training related to substance abuse, \$1,000,000.
 - (5) To the University of Alabama at Birmingham for residencies in psychiatry related to the study and treatment of substance abuse, \$1,000,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall be used for a residency in Montgomery.
 - (6) To the Department of Public Health for purchase of Naloxone for distribution to state and local agencies and

58	Section 2. All funds appropriated in this act not
59	expended in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, shall
60	not revert, but shall be carried forward for the purpose
61	appropriated.
