6	Pharmacy regulates compounding pharmacies. Existing law
7	requires not more than three pharmacy technicians per
8	pharmacist while compounding.
9	This bill would specify that while compounding
10	the number of pharmacy technicians shall comply with
11	the ratios for supervision as provided by rule of the
12	board.

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19	Relating to the Board of Pharmacy and compounding
20	pharmacies; to further provide for the number of pharmacy
21	technicians while compounding to comply with the ratios for
22	supervision as provided by rule of the board.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 34-23-151 of the Code of Alabama
25	1975, is amended to read as follows:
26	" §34-23-151
27	(a) Any pharmacist who engages in drug compounding
28	shall be proficient in compounding and shall continually

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- expand his or her compounding knowledge by participating in seminars or studying appropriate literature, or both.
- 31 (b) Pharmacy technicians may assist pharmacists in the 32 preparation of compounds. When a written procedure for a 33 compound is not on file at the pharmacy, a pharmacist must 34 direct the preparation of the compound. At all times, a 35 pharmacist shall verify the weight or volume of all active 36 ingredients of a compound. While compounding, there shall be 37 no more than three technicians per pharmacist the number of pharmacy technicians shall comply with the ratios for 38 39 supervision as provided by rule of the board.
- 40 (c) A pharmacist shall have responsibility to do all of the following:
- 42 (1) Verify all prescriptions.
- 43 (2) Approve or reject all components of the compounded 44 product, drug product containers, closures, and labeling.
- 45 (3) Prepare and review all compounding records to 46 assure that no errors have occurred in the compounding 47 process.
- 48 (4) Assure the proper maintenance, cleanliness, and use 49 of all equipment used in a prescription compounding practice.
- 50 (5) Assure that only personnel authorized by the 51 supervising pharmacist shall be in the immediate vicinity of 52 the drug compounding operation."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1, 2024.
