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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, public high school students
6	may attend virtual schools or participate in virtual
7	education programs to complete their educational
8	requirements.
9	This bill would authorize the closed browser
10	remote testing of full-time virtual students for state
11	required assessments under certain conditions.
12	This bill would also specify the conditions for
13	administering the assessments.
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16	A BILL
17	TO BE ENTITLED
18	AN ACT
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20	Relating to virtual education; to authorize full-time
21	students to complete state required assessments through closed
22	browser remote testing; and to specify the conditions for
23	administering the assessments.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Any virtual school or program operating in
26	this state may administer state required assessments in a
27	virtual setting that aligns with the regular academic
28	instruction of the student, subject to all of the following



29 conditions:

30 (1) The assessment is administered to the student on an 31 assigned date and at an assigned time.

32 (2) The student attends a synchronous assessment
 33 session initiated and managed by personnel designated by the
 34 virtual school or program.

35 (3) The assessment is administered to the student 36 through a device that permits the assessment proctor to 37 monitor the student by video for the entire duration of the 38 assessment administration.

39 (4) If the assessment platform does not allow 40 integrated camera proctoring, the student uses two devices for the entire duration of the assessment administration: One 41 42 device on which the student takes the assessment and a second 43 device which allows the assessment proctor to monitor the 44 student via a camera. If the assessment platform allows for 45 the assessment proctor to view the student and background, a 46 second device is not required.

47 (5) The virtual school or program maintains a student
48 assessment taker to assessment proctor ratio of 10 to one or
49 lower.

50 (6) The student does not exit the assessment 51 administration area until instructed to do so by the assigned 52 assessment proctor.

53 (7) Submission of the assessment is verified by the 54 assessment proctor.

55 Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1,56 2024.
