CYNTHIA SELLERS-SIMON FOR HER 5 EXCEPTIONAL SERVICE TO TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY. 6 7 WHEREAS, with pride and pleasure, commendations are 8 posthumously extended to Dr. Cynthia Sellers-Simon for her 9 exceptional service to Tuskegee University; and 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Cynthia Sellers-Simon, a native of Elba, Alabama, was groomed by her parents, the late Mr. Ben 11 Daniels and the late Mrs. Onnie Bell Daniels, to live a life 12 13 of exemplary service to humankind; after graduating from Elba High School, Dr. Sellers-Simon prepared well for this 14 15 pathway in life by first achieving the Bachelor of Science Degree in Social Studies Education from Tuskegee University; 16 17 subsequent to receiving the Master of Education Degree in 18 Student Personnel Services and Counseling from Tuskegee 19 University, she pursued and was awarded the Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Higher Education Administration, with a 20 21 concentration in management, from Georgia State University; 22 Dr. Sellers-Simon also completed postdoctoral work at

23 Harvard University; and

24 WHEREAS, with this breadth of educational 25 preparedness, Dr. Sellers-Simon commenced a lifetime career 26 as a higher education administrator; in several leadership 27 roles she made and left indelible footprints in the hearts 28 and minds of her colleagues and students at Fort Valley

29 State University, Hampton University, Tuskegee University, and Allen University; as Vice President of Student Affairs 30 at Fort Valley State, Tuskegee, and Allen Universities, she 31 32 molded and directed many students' lives; she broadened 33 institutional outreach to diverse external communities as Assistant to the President at Hampton and Fort Valley State 34 Universities; additionally, Dr. Sellers-Simon found the time 35 36 to teach courses at the graduate and undergraduate levels; 37 her refereed journal publications and professional 38 presentations at local, state, and national conferences focused on student orientation and success, counseling and 39 career development, student learning, and student leadership 40 41 development; she secured scholarships and external funding 42 to implement innovative student programs and services; and

WHEREAS, globally, Dr. Sellers-Simon attended 43 44 seminars and participated in executive leadership training 45 and professional development programs in Senegal, Ghana, 46 Kenya, Tanzania, South Africa, Brazil, and England; in the local communities where she lived, she was an active member 47 48 of the NAACP, Alumnae Chapters of Delta Sigma Theta 49 Sorority, Incorporated, and The Links, Incorporated; in her 50 leisure time, she loved to travel and read and also try new adventures like white water rafting and snow skiing; she was 51 52 a fun loving person who also loved to dance; and

53 WHEREAS, Dr. Cynthia Sellers-Simon was a member of 54 the Tuskegee University, formerly Tuskegee Institute, Class 55 of 1974; she served with Representative Pebblin Walker 56 Warren as the class agent until her death; she loved and was
