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7	WHEREAS, app-based workers who are drivers or
8	couriers provide essential services to their communities;

10	WHEREAS, these workers retain full control over
11	where, when, and how they perform app-based services and are
12	therefore classified as independent contractors; and
13	WHEREAS, independent contractors may not be entitled
14	to some of the protections and benefits available to
15	employees; and
16	WHEREAS, a portable benefits framework for app-based
17	workers should be established to enable the provision of
18	income replacement, health and wellness benefits, and other
19	benefits to eligible workers; now therefore,
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
21	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is established the
22	Alabama Portable Benefits Task Force to study the need for
23	portable benefits for independent contractors.

(b) The appointing authorities shall coordinate	e their
45 appointments to ensure the task force membership is	
46 inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic	,
47 urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.	
48 (c) The task force shall: (i) study app-based w	orkers
49 and other independent contractors in this state; (ii)	
50 investigate how other states are working to provide	
51 innovative ways for app-based workers to gain access	to
52 health, wellness, retirement, and other similar benef	its;

and (iii) develop recommendations for potential legislation

to address related issues in this state.

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- one co-chair from the House of Representatives and one co-chair from the Senate at the first meeting. The task force may then meet as necessary to conduct business, either in person or remotely.
- (e) The Legislative Services Agency, the Clerk of the
 House of Representatives, and the Secretary of the Senate
 shall provide administrative and other assistance for the
 work of the task force as necessary.
- (f) (1) The legislative members of the task force shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the task force pursuant to Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
- 70 (2) The nonlegislative members of the task force
 71 shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for
 72 necessary expenses in attending meetings of the task force
 73 pursuant to the policies of their respective appointing
 74 authority.
- findings, conclusions, and recommendations for any proposed legislation to the Legislature no later than the third legislative day of each regular legislative session. Upon the filing of its report with the Legislature during the 2026 Regular Session, the task force shall stand dissolved and discharged of any future duties and liabilities.

84	a notice of all meetings, the name of each member serving on
85	the task force, and a copy of the final report and other
86	documents produced throughout the duration of the task
