Settlement Funds to develop a statewide plan for the investment and use of opioid settlement funds and review the expenditure thereof. That resolution is amended and reenacted to increase the membership of the commission to read as follows: WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has reached settlement agreements with several parties that will provide millions of dollars to the state for an undetermined period of years for the abatement of the opioid crisis; and WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that priorities for the investment of opioid settlement funds should include programs and services with evidence-based results in the treatment and prevention of opioid use and addiction; and WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that judicious		
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investment of the opioid settlement funds on behalf of
Alabama taxpayers and those impacted by the opioid crisis is
critical and requires a collaborative effort between the
Legislature, the Executive Branch, experts, and

- 30 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
- 31 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the
- 32 Oversight Commission on Alabama Opioid Settlement Funds to
- develop a statewide plan for the investment and use of
- 34 opioid settlement funds and review the expenditure of funds
- 35 appropriated to agencies and entities to ensure expenditures
- 36 achieve the best results for Alabama's opioid crisis.
- 37 (a) The membership of the commission shall consist
- 38 of all of the following:
- 39 (1) The Commissioner of the Department of Mental
- 40 Health, or his or her designee.
- 41 (2) The Commissioner of the Department of
- 42 Corrections, or his or her designee.
- 43 (3) The Director of the Board of Pardons and
- 44 Paroles, or his or her designee.
- 45 (4) The State Health Officer, or his or her
- 46 designee.
- 47 (5) The Director of Finance, or his or her designee.
- 48 (6) An expert in programs and services for opioid
- 49 treatment and abatement, appointed by the Attorney General.
- 50 (7) Two experts in programs and services for opioid
- 51 treatment and abatement, appointed by the Governor.
- 52 (8) An expert in programs and services for opioid
- treatment and abatement, appointed by the Lieutenant
- 54 Governor.

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- (9) An expert in programs and services for opioid treatment and abatement for veterans, appointed by the Commissioner of the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 58 (10) The Speaker of the House of Representatives, or 59 his or her designee.
- 60 (11) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or his 61 or her designee.
- 62 (12) The Chair of the Senate Finance and
- 63 Taxation-General Fund Committee, or his or her designee.
- (13) The Chair of the House Ways and Means-General
- Fund Committee, or his or her designee.
- 66 (14) Two members of the House of Representatives
- 67 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 68 (15) Two members of the Senate, appointed by the
- 69 President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 70 (16) The Minority Leader of the House of
- 71 Representatives, or his or her designee.
- 72 (17) The Minority Leader of the Senate, or his or
- 73 her designee.
- 74 (b) Appointments made pursuant to Act 2023-383,
- 75 shall continue to be effective until any subsequent
- 76 appointments are made by the appointing authority.
- 77 Subsequent or additional appointments made pursuant to this
- 78 resolution shall be made within 30 days following passage of
- 79 this resolution.
- 80 (c) The Oversight Commission on Alabama Opioid
- 81 Settlement Funds shall be inclusive and reflect the racial,

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82 gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of 83

the state.

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(d) The Chair of the House Ways and Means-General 84 85 Fund Committee shall serve as chair of the commission. The 86 commission shall meet as soon as practical at a time and place set by the chair. The commission shall meet at the 87 88 call of the chair following the initial meeting and as 89 investment plans are presented for review but not less than 90 semiannually. Meetings shall be governed in the same manner

as the Legislature for all purposes, including notice.

- (e) The legislative members of the commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the commission in accordance with Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
- 97 (f) Other members of the commission may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending meetings of 98 99 the commission according to policies and procedures of their respective appointing authorities. 100
- (g) Pursuant to Section 36-14-17.1, Code of Alabama 101 102 1975, the commission shall provide to the Secretary of State 103 a notice of all meetings, the name of each member's service on the commission, and a copy of its findings and other 104 105 documents produced throughout the duration of the 106 commission.
- (h) The amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) 107 108 shall be the total amount that may be expended by the commission in any one year. 109



110	(i) The commission shall continue in existence until
111	all opioid settlement funds have been appropriated and
112	expended, at which time the commission shall stand
113	dissolved.
