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4 HJR\_\_\_\_ REQUIRING THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA TO CONDUCT A
5 STUDY ON MODERNIZING K-12 EDUCATION SCHOOL FUNDING.

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7 WHEREAS, the Foundation Program for funding K-12 8 education in Alabama is a resource-based system that was 9 adopted in 1995 and began operation in the 1995-1996 school 10 year; and

11 WHEREAS, the Foundation Program is funded from state 12 and local tax dollars with the local share coming from local 13 property taxes of 10-mills that each system must levy to 14 participate in the program while the state costs come from 15 the Education Trust Fund; and

16 WHEREAS, the Foundation Program provides funding to 17 school districts based on the anticipated costs of resources 18 and inputs, such as salaries, basic financial support for 19 classrooms, and operations money, but provides minimal 20 additional state funding for students with disabilities or 21 to address other individual needs of students; and

22 WHEREAS, the Foundation Program is complex, 23 containing few techniques for lawmakers to employ to address 24 the changing needs of students and school districts and no 25 clear way to link state funding priorities to local spending 26 decisions and the outcomes of various student groups; and

27 WHEREAS, local school systems face a myriad of28 challenges in meeting the unique educational needs of the

29 students they serve; there is a need for greater flexibility 30 to provide the educational services required of teachers, 31 administration, and school systems in general; and

32 WHEREAS, Alabama is one of only six states that only 33 uses a resource-based funding formula for K-12 education, while 41 states use a student-based funding formula where 34 35 school districts receive funding based on the number of students enrolled or in attendance with additional funding 36 being provided based on characteristics of the students of 37 38 the district, such as low-income, poverty, disability, and status as an English language learner, or a gifted student; 39 40 and

41 WHEREAS, many outside studies have concluded that 42 states should shift K-12 education school funding away from 43 a resource-based system and into a modern, weighted, 44 student-based funding model that would reflect the true cost 45 of educating various student groups and moving all students 46 toward proficiency; now therefore,

47 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Legislature of Alabama 48 49 shall conduct a study on modernizing the current K-12 school 50 funding model into a student-based funding model, including any additional costs associated with the transition, as well 51 52 as any necessary changes in law that may be required to 53 implement a new statutory framework that supports meaningful education to Alabama's K-12 students. 54

55 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature shall 56 deliver the findings of its study and any proposed

57 legislation to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of 58 Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate 59 by February 1, 2025.

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
