4 HJR____ MOURNING THE DEATH AND CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF MRS.
5 LAMONA HALL LUCAS.

7 WHEREAS, it is with profound sadness that we mourn 8 the death and celebrate the life of Mrs. Lamona Hall Lucas 9 of Mobile, Alabama, at the age of 90 years; and

10 WHEREAS, her passing leaves a void in the lives of 11 her loving family, many friends, and the entire community 12 where she was highly regarded; and

13 WHEREAS, Mrs. Lucas was born on November 25, 1934, in 14 Troy, Alabama, to Lamon Hall and Vera Mae Hall; she attended 15 Troy High School where she was a cheerleader; she was a 16 graduate of Peabody University and the University of South 17 Alabama; and

18 WHEREAS, Mrs. Lucas taught at Charles Henderson High 19 School in Troy prior to her family moving to Mobile in 1964, 20 when her husband became the first Athletic Director at the 21 University of South Alabama; and

22 WHEREAS, she earned her Master of Science Degree from 23 the University of South Alabama and became the Vocational 24 Rehabilitation Counselor at Rotary Rehabilitation Hospital 25 (RRH); from there, she became the Director of RRH and then 26 the Vocational Rehabilitation Services Director of Alabama 27 Department of Rehab Services (ADRS); in 1994, she became the 28 first Commissioner of the Department of Rehabilitation

29 Services for Alabama, a position she held until her 30 retirement in 1999; and

31 WHEREAS, her visionary skills led her to lead 32 Foundations in Mobile as well as establishing new programs 33 within the State of Alabama including, Miss Wheelchair, 34 Traumatic Brain Injury Task Force, and Wheelchair 35 Basketball; her bright and artistic eye led many 36 organizations to form leadership positions for many citizens 37 with disabilities; and

38 WHEREAS, during her tenure as Director, she was 39 called upon to assist in the writing of the Americans with 40 Disabilities Act of 1990; this was a source of much pride 41 for her and for ADRS; she was in the Rose Garden when it was 42 officially signed into law; and

43 WHEREAS, although her presence will be greatly 44 missed, the memory of Mrs. Lamona Hall Lucas will be 45 cherished in the hearts of all who knew and loved her; now 46 therefore,

47 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 48 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the death of Mrs. Lamona 49 Hall Lucas is recorded with deep sadness, and this 50 resolution is offered in tribute to her life and with 51 heartfelt sympathy to her family, whose grief is shared by 52 many.
