HONORING MR. HOLLIS ISBELL FOR BEING INDUCTED INTO THE 2024 AUBURN UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE HALL OF HONOR.

WHEREAS, highest commendations are herein extended to Mr. Hollis Isbell for being inducted into the 2024 Auburn University College of Agriculture Hall of Honor in the Production Category; and

WHEREAS, in December 1984, the Auburn University Agricultural Alumni Association approved a resolution to establish the Alabama Agriculture Hall of Honor with a sole purpose to bestow honor and recognition upon living Alabamians who have made significant contributions to the state's agricultural industry; and

WHEREAS, Hollis Isbell is a third generation row-crop farmer from Colbert County, Alabama; he has a passion for growing cotton and is known for being an innovator in technology and implementing the latest equipment to manage his family farm, Isbell Farms; he was a pioneer in the use of irrigation on row crops and was integral in the oversight and establishment of the Spring Valley Gin; his ideas and practices are admired across North Alabama and the entire Cotton Belt, earning him the annual Cotton Achievement Award in 2002, as selected by Cotton Grower Magazine; and

WHEREAS, Hollis Isbell has the outstanding ability to build consensus among his peers to assure a successful

29 outcome; his poised leadership was a major factor in  
30 expansion of the boll weevil eradication program through the  
31 final areas of Alabama, including the Tennessee Valley; he  
32 worked tirelessly to persuade growers of the significant  
33 benefits of the program and encourage them to vote in favor  
34 of the required referendum; arguably, this program, which  
35 was highly debated, has proven to be the most significant  
36 biological advancement in Alabama agriculture in the past  
37 century; and,

38 WHEREAS, Mr. Isbell is known for his strong work  
39 ethic that he has passed down to his children and  
40 grandchildren; Isbell Farms, now managed by the second and  
41 third generations, is the largest farm in Colbert County;

43 WHEREAS, even with Mr. Isbell'S rich and innovative  
44 history of contributing to agriculture, his vision has  
45 always been to look to the future with a desire to increase  
46 production while also continuing to be a good steward of  
47 God's land; and

48 WHEREAS, Hollis Isbell served as Chairman of the  
49 American Cotton Producers of the National Cotton Council in  
50 2001, President of Southern Cotton Growers, a member of  
51 Cotton Incorporated Board of Directors, Chairman of the  
52 Cotton Commission, Chairman of the ALFA State Cotton  
53 Committee, a member on the Colbert County Alabama Farmers  
54 Federation Board of Directors, and as a Deacon at Woodward  
55 Avenue Baptist Church, where he also served on the Pastoral  
56 Search Committee; and
