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4	HJR ESTABLISHING THE ALABAMA-JAPAN LEGISLATIVE EXCHANGE
5	GROUP.
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7	WHEREAS, The State of Alabama and the Nation of Japan
8	are established partners in the global economy, with mutual
9	trade in 2022 between Alabama and Japan reaching nearly two
10	billion dollars; and
11	WHEREAS, the extent of goods and services exchanged
12	between Alabama and Japan is wide-ranging, including
13	mineral, fuel, aircraft, spacecraft, vehicles, wood pulp,
14	paper, organic and inorganic chemicals, machinery,
15	computers, media equipment, ammunition, pharmaceuticals, and
16	financial services; and
17	WHEREAS, Japanese confidence in the initiative and
18	reliability of Alabama workers is attested to by the Honda
19	Manufacturing Plant in Lincoln and the Mazda Toyota
20	Manufacturing Plant near Huntsville, which together employ
21	over 8,000 of our residents, while nearly 9,000 more
22	Alabamians work for approximately 90 other Japanese
23	companies; and
24	WHEREAS, Alabama's relationship with Japan transcends
25	purely economic endeavors, with friendship expressed through
26	sister city relationships between Birmingham and Hitachi,
27	Anniston and Tatsuno, Tuscaloosa and Narachino, Dothan and

Sakado, Mobile and Ichara, and Montevallo and Echizen; and

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29	WHEREAS, the Japanese Garden in the Birmingham
30	Botanical Gardens is recognized by the government of Japan
31	as an official Japanese Cultural Center, and many Alabamians
32	take a lively interest in Japanese culture through
33	organizations such as Bonsai and garden societies,
34	exhibitions, events such as the Sakura festival in
35	Tuscaloosa, and the Japan-America Society of Alabama (JASA);
36	and
37	WHEREAS, students at Alabama universities and
38	colleges have been enriched by visits to Japan for study,
39	including students from Birmingham-Southern College, Samford
40	University, University of West Alabama, The University of
41	Alabama at Birmingham, The University of Alabama, Auburn
42	University, The University of Alabama in Huntsville, Troy
43	University, Talladega College, and Miles College; and
44	WHEREAS, Japan is a bulwark of democracy in a region
45	overshadowed by China and threatened by North Korea, hosting
46	approximately 55,000 American military personnel on more
47	than 80 bases; and
48	WHEREAS, in addition to being a regional ally, Japan
49	is a key partner of the United States on the international
50	stage, collaborating with our nation in many critical areas
51	that include global security, development assistance,
52	environmental protection, new energy technologies,
53	supercomputing, critical materials, and space; now
54	therefore,
55	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
56	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Alabama-Japan

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- 57 Legislative Exchange Group is created to pursue friendship
- and cooperation with the people, institutions, and
- businesses of Japan through exchanges and programs.
- 60 (a) The Alabama-Japan Legislative Exchange Group
- shall be comprised of the following members:
- (1) A majority member and a minority member of the
- 63 Senate, to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
- 64 Senate, one of which shall be the senator sponsoring this
- 65 joint resolution.
- 66 (2) A majority member and a minority member of the
- 67 House of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of
- 68 the House of Representatives, one of which shall be the
- 69 representative sponsoring this joint resolution.
- 70 (3) Any member of the Senate or the House of
- 71 Representatives who desires to strengthen relations between
- 72 Alabama and Japan.
- 73 (4) A member to act as liaison between the exchange
- 74 group and the Office of the Governor, to be appointed by the
- 75 Governor.
- 76 (b) In order for the legislative exchange group to
- 77 credibly represent the people of Alabama, the racial,
- 78 gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of
- 79 this state shall be encouraged and reflected among its
- 80 membership.
- 81 (c)(1) The initial meeting of the Alabama-Japan
- 82 Legislative Exchange Group shall be called by the senior
- 83 Senate member no later than December 1, 2024.

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- a. The members shall elect a chair and a vice chair from the legislative membership, neither of which shall be
- 86 from the same house.
- b. The members may elect a secretary and such other
- 88 officers as may be needed to conduct the work of the
- 89 legislative exchange group.
- 90 (2) The chair shall convene meetings of the
- 91 legislative exchange group as often as is expedient. After
- 92 the organizational meeting, the legislative exchange group
- 93 may meet by electronic means.
- 94 (3) A quorum for a meeting shall be a majority of the
- 95 members.
- 96 (d) The work of the legislative exchange group may
- 97 include, but not be limited to, any of the following in
- 98 pursuit of its goals:
- 99 (1) Any member may propose any economic, educational,
- 100 cultural, or governmental initiative to pursue on behalf of
- 101 the State of Alabama with Japan.
- 102 (2) The chair may assign study topics and reporting
- 103 responsibilities to different members.
- 104 (3) Nonprofit organizations, including the
- 105 Japan-America Society of Alabama, may be invited to share
- 106 knowledge and expertise, especially on establishing ties
- 107 with Japanese companies and organizations.
- 108 (4) The Consul General of Japan in Atlanta and any
- 109 honorary consul appointed by Japan in Alabama may be
- informed of the group's work on a periodic basis.

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111	(e)(1) The legislative exchange group shall annually
112	report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the
113	Speaker of the House of Representatives no later the tenth
114	day of the Regular Session of the Legislature on the number
115	of times it met during the preceding 12 months, and shall
116	include minutes of its meetings, with any interim
117	recommendations or requests that may assist its work.
118	(2) The legislative exchange group shall submit a
119	final report on its findings and recommendations to the
120	Governor no later than the conclusion of the 2026 Regular
121	Session of the Legislature.
122	(3) Upon submission of its final report, the
123	Alabama-Japan Legislative Exchange Group shall dissolve.
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
