4	HR RECOGNIZING MARCH 2024 AS COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS
5	MONTH IN ALABAMA.

7	WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is the second leading
8	cause of cancer death among men and women combined in the
9	United States; and
10	WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is one of the most highly
11	preventable forms of cancer because screening tests can find
12	polyps that can be removed before becoming cancerous; and
13	WHEREAS, screening tests can detect colorectal cancer
14	early, when treatment works best; and
15	WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and
16	Prevention estimates that if every individual aged 50 or
17	older had regular screening tests, as many as 60 percent of
18	deaths from colorectal cancer could be prevented; and
19	WHEREAS, when detected early, the five-year survival
20	rate for patients with localized colorectal cancer is 90
21	percent, but only 39 percent of all diagnoses are diagnosed
22	at this stage, mostly due to low rates of screening; and
23	WHEREAS, colorectal cancer screenings can effectively
24	reduce colorectal cancer incidence and mortality, yet, one
25	in three adults over 50 years of age are not up to date with
26	recommended colorectal cancer screening; and
27	WHEREAS, deaths from colorectal cancer occur
28	disproportionately among those who are underserved or

29	underinsured; and
30	WHEREAS, since 2014, colorectal cancer rates have
31	been increasing by two percent per year in people younger
32	than 50 years of age; and
33	WHEREAS, public awareness and education campaigns on
34	colorectal cancer prevention, screening, and symptoms are
35	held during the month March each year; and
36	WHEREAS, educational efforts can help provide
37	information to the public of methods of prevention and
38	screening, as well as about symptoms for early detection;
39	and
40	WHEREAS, greater awareness of colon cancer and the
41	means to prevent it could save the lives of hundreds of
42	Alabamians every year; and
43	WHEREAS, observing a Colorectal Cancer Awareness
44	Month during the month of March would provide a special
45	opportunity to offer education on the importance of early
46	detection and screening; now therefore,
47	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
48	LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we recognize the importance of
49	colorectal screenings.
50	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we encourage all
51	Alabamians who are age 45 and older to get a colorectal
52	screening, and we recognize March 2024 as Colorectal Cancer
53	Awareness Month in Alabama.
