4 HR____MOURNING THE DEATH AND CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF CHIEF
5 APOSTLE CLEVELAND SYLVESTER SMITH.

7 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the 8 death on April 7, 2024, of Chief Apostle Cleveland Sylvester 9 Smith of Mobile, Alabama, at the age of 82; his passing leaves a void in the lives of his loving family, many 10 friends, and the community where he was highly regarded; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Apostle Smith was a native of Hattiesburg, 13 Mississippi, and a graduate of Rowan High School, Class of 14 1960; he spent summers in Mobile, Alabama, with his mother 15 and stepfather and shared his musical talents with local Mobile Baptist churches; and 16

WHEREAS, in 1962, Apostle Smith was drafted into the 17 18 United States Army where he served two years and was 19 honorably discharged; he remained in Anchorage, Alaska, for more than a year before moving to Modesto, California, and 20 21 again to Los Angeles, California; in 1968, he returned to Mobile and reunited with St. Peters Baptist Church and 22 23 restarted his music ministry and played citywide for several 24 Baptist choirs; and

25 WHEREAS, in 1969, Apostle Smith became the Minister 26 of Music for the Mt. Olive No. 1 Missionary Baptist Chruch; 27 he suffered an unexpected illness and spent 23 days in the 28 hospital; during his illness, he experienced death several

times and became paralyzed; by miracle, God revived him each time and he would recover his health; and

WHEREAS, in 1970, he organized an interdenominational 31 32 gospel music group, The Cleveland Smith Chorale, which grew 33 to over 125 members; they later incorporated and became a nonprofit organization carrying God's message through song 34 35 and aiding the needy; in 1972, he accepted his calling and 36 preached his initial sermon at St. Peters Baptist Church and 37 studied Baptist Fellowship Seminary Classes at the Mobile 38 Extension of Selma University; and

39 WHEREAS, in 1974, St. John's Deliverance Temple, Incorporated, was organized and continued the Chorale's 40 41 outreach; through St. John's Deliverance Temple, as its 42 Pastor, he was able to reach more people through more 43 mission opportunities, including ministries to the homeless, home-bound, incarcerated, and those on death row; their 44 45 outreach expanded through Christian education with the 46 opening of St. John's Christian Academy in 1986, now called St. John's School of Tomorrow; and 47

WHEREAS, Apostle Smith adopted three children;
daughters, Bernice and Latisha; and son, Kendrick; his three
children and five grandchildren will continue his legacy;

52 WHEREAS, although his presence will be greatly 53 missed, the memory of Apostle Smith will be cherished in the 54 hearts of all who knew and loved him; now therefore,
