7	WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, is
8	the first intercollegiate historically African American
9	sorority; it was founded on January 15, 1908, at Howard
10	University in Washington D.C., by a group of 16 students led
11	by Ethel Hedgemon Lyle; the sorority was incorporated on
12	January 29, 1913; and
13	WHEREAS, the sorority is one of the nation's largest
14	Greek Letter Organizations, having more than 350,000 members
15	in 1,024 chapters in the United States of America and
16	several other countries; the members share the bonds of
17	sisterhood and are committed to servant-leadership; and
18	WHEREAS, Omicron Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha
19	Sorority, Incorporated, received its charter on October 24,
20	1924, in Birmingham, Alabama, becoming the 15th chapter of
21	the sorority and the first graduate chapter to be chartered
22	in the Southeastern Region; the eight charter members, Hilda
23	Evans, Vivan F. Bell, Jessie Coleman, Wilma Davis, Mabel
24	Harris, Eunice Hudson, Thelma Kingsley, and Veronica Pierce,
25	became the first African American members of a sorority in
26	the State of Alabama; and
27	WHEREAS, the chapter's membership has included

thousands of professional women who are dedicated public

29	servants and graduates from universities throughout the
30	United States; today, chapter membership stands at 385, the
31	largest in the chapter's history; and
32	WHEREAS, in the early 1950s, under the leadership of
33	A. Lucile Brewer, Omicron Omega Chapter experienced another
34	milestone by becoming the first Black Greek Letter
35	Organization to purchase a chapter house in the State of
36	Alabama; additionally, in this same timeframe, they were
37	instrumental in establishing the Birmingham Chapter of the
38	Panhellenic Council; and
39	WHEREAS, over the course of the last century, Omicron
40	Omega Chapter has had a profound philanthropic impact on the
41	greater Birmingham community, having donated over \$1.5
42	million in charitable contributions to organizations such as
43	the United Negro College Fund, National Association for the
44	Advancement of Colored People, Miles College, The Sickle
45	Cell Foundation of Central Alabama, March of Dimes, Dance
46	Across Birmingham, and the American Heart Association; and
47	WHEREAS, additionally, Omicron Omega Chapter has
48	invested time and financial support to Birmingham children
49	and their education; the members have spent thousands of
50	hours volunteering in local schools, and the Chapter has
51	distributed over \$500,000 in college scholarships to
52	Birmingham-area students; and
53	Whereas, Omicron Omega Chapter has overseen the
54	establishment of five undergraduate chapters on college
55	campuses in the greater Birmingham area: Gamma Pi at Miles
56	College in 1970; Iota Phi at The University of Alabama at

61	its philanthropic arm, the Cultural and Educational
62	Advancement Foundation, to further its philanthropic impact
63	on the Birmingham community; in 2022, CEAF opened The Pearl
