10	Section 16-25-26 and Section 36-27-8.2, as amended by Act
11	2023-334 and Act 2023-564, Code of Alabama 1975, to remove
12	certain conditions under which a person who has retired from
13	the Teachers' Retirement System and the Employees' Retirement
14	System may serve for his or her full compensation in an
15	elected public office without suspension of retirement
16	benefits.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Section $16-25-26$ and Section $36-27-8.2$, as
19	amended by Act 2023-334 and Act 2023-564, of the Code of
20	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
21	" §16-25-26
22	(a) Any person who is retired under the Teachers'
23	Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity,
24	including as an independent contractor, with any employer
25	participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the
26	Teachers' Retirement System without suspension of his or her
27	retirement allowance provided that (1) the person is not
28	employed in a permanent full-time capacity and (2) the



person's compensation from the employer in calendar year 2016 does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). Beginning in calendar year 2017, and each calendar year thereafter, the annual earning limit shall be increased by the same percentage increase as the increase in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Any increase in the annual earning limit shall be rounded to the next lowest multiple of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with any amount in excess of the one thousand dollar (\$1,000) multiple considered in determining the increase for the following year. Each adjustment shall be based on the increase in the index for the preceding 12-month period ending on September 30 and the increase shall be effective for the following calendar year.

(b) Any person serving as an elected official who has retired from the Teachers' Retirement System may serve for his or her full compensation in an elected public office with the state, a county, or an incorporated municipality without suspension of retirement benefits; provided that under no circumstances shall such a person participate in or accrue additional benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement System for that service, and provided that under no circumstances shall a person whose retirement is based upon service as an elected official continue in or return to such office and receive both pension benefits and salary; provided further, that this subsection shall apply to elected officials whose participation in the Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement



System is constitutionally required to be upon the same terms and conditions as specified by law for other employees in the retirement system if such elected official's compensation does not exceed the annual earning limits provided in subsection (a). Any provision of this subsection to the contrary notwithstanding, a retiree serving as a local elected superintendent of education shall not receive both pension benefits and salary unless his or her compensation as a local elected superintendent of education does not exceed the annual earning limits provided in subsection (a).

- (c) The responsibility for compliance with this section is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree performing duties under this section shall certify to the employer any information required in order to carry out this section. The retiree shall provide written notice of the postretirement employment under this section to the Teachers' Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under this section."

(a) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity,
including as an independent contractor, with any employer
participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the

an individual whose retirement is based upon service as an

elected official continue in or return to the office and

113	that this subsection shall apply to elected officials whose
114	participation in the Teachers' Retirement System or the
115	Employees' Retirement System is constitutionally required to
116	be upon the same terms and conditions as specified by law for
117	other employees in the retirement system if the elected
118	official's compensation does not exceed the annual earning
119	limits provided in subsection (a). Any provision of this
120	subsection to the contrary notwithstanding, a retiree serving
121	as a local elected superintendent of education shall not
122	receive both pension benefits and salary unless his or her
123	compensation as a local elected superintendent of education
124	does not exceed the annual earning limits provided in
125	subsection (a).

- (c) The responsibility for compliance with this section is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree performing duties under this section shall certify to the employer any information required in order to carry out this section. The retiree shall provide written notice of the postretirement employment under this section to the Employees' Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under this section.
- (d) (1) Any individual who is retired under the



 Officers' Standards and Training certification, and was

 classified as either a law enforcement officer, as defined in



- 141 Section 36-27-59, or a state policeman, as defined in Section
- 36-27-1, prior to retirement, may perform duties as either a
- school resource officer, as defined in Section 16-1-44.1, or a
- 144 correctional officer with the Department of Corrections
- 145 without suspension of his or her retirement allowance,
- 146 provided that the compensation earned does not exceed
- fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year.
- 148 (2) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
- 149 Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers'
- 150 Standards and Training certification, and meets any of the
- 151 following criteria, may perform duties as a correctional
- 152 officer with the Department of Corrections without suspension
- of his or her retirement allowance, provided that the
- 154 compensation earned does not exceed fifty-two thousand dollars
- 155 (\$52,000) per year:
- 156 a. Was classified as a law enforcement officer, as
- defined in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement.
- b. Was classified as a state policeman, as defined in
- 159 Section 36-27-1, prior to retirement.
- 160 c. Was classified as a correctional officer, as defined
- in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement, and retired pursuant
- 162 to Section 36-27-16(a)(1)c.
- 163 (3) No individual may be employed pursuant to this
- subsection after December 31, 2026."
