- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 7 Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the
- 8 following terms have the following meanings, unless the
- 9 context requires otherwise:
- 10 (1) BOVINE. Any buffalo, bison, cattle, or oxen.
- 11 (2) BOVINE ACTIVITY. Any activity involving one or more
- bovine, including, but not limited to, any of the following:
- a. Grazing, herding, feeding, branding, milking, or
- 14 other activity that involves the care or maintenance of a
- 15 bovine.
- b. A bovine auction or production sale.
- 17 c. A bovine show, fair, or competition.
- d. Bovine training or teaching activities.
- e. Boarding a bovine.
- f. Riding, inspecting, or evaluating a bovine.
- 21 (3) BOVINE OWNER. Any person with ownership rights to a
- 22 bovine.
- 23 (4) INHERENT RISK OF A BOVINE ACTIVITY. A danger or
- 24 condition that is an integral part of a bovine activity,
- including, but not limited to, any of the following:
- 26 a. The propensity of a bovine to behave in ways that
- 27 may result in injury, loss, damage, or death to a person on or
- 28 around the bovine.



- 29 b. The unpredictability of a bovine's reaction to 30 sounds, sudden movements, and unfamiliar objects, individuals,
- 31 and other animals.
- 32 c. Certain hazards on a property, such as surface and subsurface conditions.
- 34 d. Collisions with other bovines or nonmotorized objects.
- 36 (5) PERSON. An individual, corporation, or any other 37 legal entity.
- 38 (b)(1) A bovine owner shall not be liable for any
 39 injury, loss, damage, or death of a person resulting from an
 40 inherent risk of a bovine activity.
- 41 (2) Except as provided in subsection (c), no person 42 shall make any claim against, maintain an action against, or 43 recover from a bovine owner for injury, loss, damage, or death 44 of a person resulting from an inherent risk of a bovine 45 activity.
- 46 (c)(1) Subsection (b) shall not be construed to prevent 47 or limit the liability of a bovine owner if the owner does any 48 of the following:
- a. Fails to post and maintain a warning sign pursuant to subsection (d).
- 51 b. Commits an act or omission that constitutes willful 52 or wanton disregard for the safety of a person, and that act 53 or omission causes the injury, loss, damage, or death of a 54 person.
- 55 c. Has actual knowledge of the dangerous propensity of 56 a particular bovine that is not open and obvious, does not



- 57 make the danger known to a person, and the danger proximately 58 causes injury, sickness, damage, or death to the person.
- (2) Article 2 of Chapter 15 of Title 35, Code of
 Alabama 1975, shall not apply to a bovine owner if injury,
 loss, damage, or death of a person results from an inherent
 risk of a bovine activity.
 - (d) (1) This section shall not apply unless a bovine owner posts and maintains a sign that contains the warning notice specified in subdivision (2). The sign shall be placed in a clearly visible location on or near a stable, corral, fence, enclosure, or arena where the owner conducts bovine activities. The warning notice shall appear in black letters, with each letter being a minimum of one inch in height.
- 70 (2) The sign described in subdivision (1) shall contain 71 the following warning notice:

72 "WARNING

Under Alabama Law, a bovine owner is not liable for
any injury, loss, damage, or death of a person
resulting from the inherent risks of bovine activities,
pursuant to this act."

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Section 2. This act shall become effective on January 1,
