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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, members of local boards of
6	education are authorized to receive up to six hundred
7	dollars (\$600) compensation per month.
8	Also under existing law, the State
9	Superintendent of Education is required to develop
10	continuing education and training programs for members
11	of local boards of education.
12	This bill would increase the compensation that
13	members of local boards of education are eligible to
14	receive to nine hundred dollars (\$900) per month.
15	This bill would also require the compensation of
16	a member of a local board of education be placed in
17	escrow if certain continuing education and training
18	requirements are not met, and would revert the funds
19	back to the local board of education if funds remain in
20	escrow when the member leaves his or her office.

24	TO BE ENTITLED
25	AN ACT
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27	Relating to the compensation of members of local boards
28	of education; to amend Section 16-1-26, Code of Alabama 1975;

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29 to repeal Section 16-8-5, Code of Alabama 1975; to increase 30 the maximum compensation for members of local boards of 31 education; to place the compensation of a member of a local 32 board of education in escrow if certain continuing education 33 and training requirements are not met; and to provide 34 procedures if a member of a local board of education leaves 35 office while his or her compensation remains in escrow. 36 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 37 Section 1. Section 16-1-26, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 38 39 "\$16-1-26 (a) Members of city and county school local boards of 40 education are authorized to receive reasonable compensation 41 for their services, not to exceed six hundred dollars (\$600) 42 43 nine hundred dollars (\$900) per month, unless set at a higher figure by a local act, upon approval by a majority vote of the 44 45 members at the board's annual meeting. Compensation shall be 46 in addition to actual traveling and other necessary expenses 47 incurred in attending meetings and transacting business of the

48 board.

49 (b) The compensation, actual traveling expenses, and
50 other necessary expenses incurred shall be paid as other
51 ordinary and necessary expenses of the board.

(c) Any individual <u>school board member member of a</u>
<u>local board of education</u>, at his or her option, may refuse to
accept all or any portion of the approved compensation.
(d) The compensation of any member of a local board of

56 education who is not in compliance with the continuing

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education and training requirements developed pursuant to
Section 16-1-41.1 shall be held in escrow by the local board
of education until the member becomes compliant. In the event
that a member vacates, resigns from, or otherwise leaves his
or her position as a member of the local board of education
with any compensation remaining in escrow, those remaining
funds shall then revert back to the local board of education."
Section 2. Section 16-8-5, Code of Alabama 1975,
relating to the compensation of members of county boards of
education, is repealed.
Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
1, 2024.
