5	Under existing law, an individual convicted of a
6	crime of moral turpitude loses his or her right to
7	vote.
8	This bill would remove certain crimes from the
9	list of offenses that are considered crimes of moral
10	turpitude.

14	TO BE ENTITLED
15	AN ACT
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18	Relating to voting; to amend Section 17-3-30.1, Code of
19	Alabama 1975, to remove certain crimes from the list of
20	offenses that are considered crimes of moral turpitude.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Section 17-3-30.1, Code of Alabama 1975, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	"§17-3-30.1
25	(a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the
26	Felony Voter Disqualification Act.
27	(b)(1) The Legislature finds and declares that both of
28	the following:



a. Article VIII That Section 177 of the Constitution of
Alabama of 19012022, now appearing as Section 177 of Article
VIII of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
Alabama of 1901, as amended, provides that Alabama citizens
residents shall lose the right to vote when convicted of a
crime only if the conviction was for a felony involving moral
turpitude.

b. Under Prior to 2017, under general law, there is was no comprehensive list of felonies that involve moral turpitude which disqualify a person from exercising his or her right to vote. Neither individuals with felony convictions nor election officials have had a comprehensive, authoritative source for determining if a felony conviction involves moral turpitude and is therefore a disqualifying felony.

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(2) The purposes of this section are:

a. To give full effect to Article VIII Section 177 of
the Constitution of Alabama of 19012022, now appearing as
Section 177 of Article VIII of the Official Recompilation of
the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

48 b. To ensure that no one is wrongly excluded from the49 electoral franchise.

50 c. To provide a comprehensive list of acts that 51 constitute moral turpitude for the limited purpose of 52 disqualifying <u>a person an individual</u> from exercising his or 53 her right to vote.

54 (c) For purposes of Article VIII Section 177 of the
55 Constitution of Alabama of 19012022, now appearing as Section
56 177 of Article VIII of the Official Recompilation of the



Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, a person an 57 58 individual is disqualified to vote by reason of conviction of 59 a felony involving moral turpitude only when convicted of any 60 of the following offenses in a degree constituting a felony: 61 (1) Murder as defined in the following sections: 62 a. (d) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted as 208 209 determining moral turpitude for any purpose other than disqualifying a person an individual from exercising his or 210 211 her right to vote. (e) The felonies involving moral turpitude listed in 212 213 subsection (c) are the only felonies for which a person, upon 214 conviction, may be disgualified from voting. Additional 215 felonies may be added to the list in subsection (c) only by amendment to this section." 216 217 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2024. 218
