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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would apply to any Class 3
6	municipality organized under Act 618 of the 1973
7	Regular Session and would provide that the mayor would
8	appoint the members of any city airport authority. The
9	appointments by the mayor would be subject to the
10	confirmation by the city council. The bill would apply
11	to fill any vacancies after the expiration of the term
12	of an existing member of the authority.
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14	A BILL
15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to any Class 3 municipality organized under
19	Act 618 of the 1973 Regular Session (Acts 1973, p. 879),
20	providing for the mayor-council form of government in certain
21	municipalities having a certain population according to the
22	1970 or any subsequent federal decennial census; to amend
23	Section 45-51A-33.56 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to
24	the powers of the city council, and Section 45-51A-33.95 of
25	the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the powers of the mayor;
26	to provide that the mayor would appoint the members of any
27	city airport authority; to provide that the appointments by
28	the mayor would be subject to confirmation by the city



29	council; and to provide that this act would apply to vacancies
30	after the effective date of this act.
31	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
32	Section 1. Sections 45-51A-33.56 and 45-51A-33.95, Code
33	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
34	"\$45-51A-33.56
35	All powers of the city, including all powers vested in
36	it by this part, by the laws, general and local, of the state,
37	and by Title <u>6211, of the Code of Alabama of 1940, as</u>
38	$\frac{1}{2}$ and the determination of all matters of policy, shall
39	be vested in the council. Without limitation of the foregoing,
40	the council shall have power to:
41	(1) Establish administrative departments and distribute
42	the work of divisions.
43	(2) Adopt the budget of the city.
44	(3) Authorize the issuance of bonds or warrants.
45	(4) Inquire into the conduct of any office, department,
46	or agency of the city and make investigations as to municipal
47	affairs.
48	(5) Appoint Except as provided in Section 45-51A-33.95,
49	appoint the members of all boards, commissions, or other
50	bodies authorized hereunder or by law. This provision for
51	appointment of members of boards, commissions, or other bodies
52	authorized hereunder or by law shall supersede any different
53	provision for appointment of such members contained in any
54	<pre>statute law or ordinance in effect at the time of adoption by</pre>
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	the city of the mayor-council form of government set up
56	the city of the mayor-council form of government-set up <u>established</u> by this part, and shall include power to remove



57 any member of any board, commission, or body to the same 58 extent as might be done by the governing body of the city at the time of adoption by the city of the mayor-council form of 59 60 government set up established by this part and to appoint another in his or her stead. And wherever If in any statute 61 62 law in effect at the time of adoption by the city of the 63 mayor-council form of government the chief executive officer 64 of the city is designated to act in any capacity ex-officio, 65 the mayor shall act.

(6) Succeed to all the powers, rights, and privileges
conferred upon the former governing body of the city by
statutes laws in effect at the time of adoption by the city of
the mayor-council form of government and not in conflict with
this part.

74 The mayor shall be the head of the administrative branch of the city government. He or she shall not sit with 75 76 the council nor shall he or she have a vote in its 77 proceedings. and he or she The mayor shall have the power and 78 duties herein conferred. The mayor shall be responsible for 79 the proper administration of all affairs of the city and, 80 subject to any civil service or merit system law applicable to 81 the city and except as otherwise provided herein, he or she 82 shall have power and shall be required to do all of the following: 83

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(1) Enforce all laws and ordinances.



85 (2) Appoint, with the advice and consent of the 86 council, all department heads as provided in this part. Unless 87 If a majority of the council present and voting shall do not 88 approve-of the appointment;, the appointment shall not be effective and shall be null and void. When it is necessary for 89 90 the good of the service, the mayor shall have the authority to 91 may remove officers and employees of the city who are subject 92 to the merit system that might be is in force at that time. 93 The mayor shall not have the power to appoint or remove officers and employees of any of the following: 94 95 a. Any library board of the city. b. Any board of the city having control over any park, 96 97 recreation facility, fair, or exhibit. 98 c. Any municipally-owned public utility, including 99 electric, gas, and water systems, while such utility is operating under a board constituted by law or required by the 100 terms of any indenture, mortgage, or deed of trust providing 101 102 for employment by other authority. 103 d. Any school board of the city. 104 e. Any planning board or zoning board of the city. 105 (3) Exercise administrative supervision and control 106 over all departments created by this part or by law or 107 hereafter created by the council except those enumerated in 108 paragraphs a. to e., inclusive, of subdivision (2) and except 109 those otherwise given independent status under this part. 110 (4) Keep the council fully advised as to the financial conditions and needs of the city; prepare and submit the 111

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budget annually to the council and be responsible for its

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113 administration after its adoption; prepare and submit, as of 114 the end of the fiscal year, a complete report on the financial and administrative activities of the city for such year. 115 116 (5) Recommend to the council such actions as he or she 117 may deem desirable. (6) Prepare and submit to the council such reports as 118 119 may be required of him or her the mayor. 120 (7) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by 121 this part. (8) Fix the salaries or compensations of all officers 122 123 and employees of the city who are appointable by him or her the mayor, subject to the approval of the council, and to any 124 125 civil service or merit law applicable to the city. 126 (9) a. Appoint the members of any city airport 127 authority. Appointments pursuant to this subdivision shall not affect the term of any member serving on July 1, 2024, but 128 129 shall apply to any vacancies occurring after July 1, 2024. All 130 appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the city 131 council. 132 b. The mayor shall not have the power to appoint or 133 remove any employee of any city airport authority." 134 Section 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 135 2024.
