20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center
22	Corporation may be established and created by any number of
23	individuals associated with an agricultural membership
24	advocacy organization filing articles of incorporation in the
25	office of the judge of probate of the county in which the
26	Alabama Farm Center will be located.
7	(b) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall

(b) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall operate the Alabama Farm Center for the purposes of promoting,



- showcasing, and facilitating education regarding all facets of the agricultural industry and advancing agricultural business and workforce development in this state.
  - (c) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall be governed by, and all powers of the corporation shall be exercised by, pursuant to the corporation's authorization, a board of directors that shall have five members appointed as follows, subject to confirmation by the Senate:
- 37 (1) One member appointed by the Governor.

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- 38 (2) One member appointed by the Commissioner of 39 Agriculture and Industries.
- 40 (3) One member appointed by the county commission of 41 the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located 42 who shall be a farmer and resident of that county.
  - (4) Two members appointed by the Alabama Farmers

    Federation who shall each be a farmer. One appointee shall reside in any county north of or in Pickens, Tuscaloosa, Bibb, Shelby, Coosa, Tallapoosa, or Chambers County; and the other appointee shall reside in any county south of or in Sumter, Greene, Hale, Perry, Chilton, Elmore, Macon, or Lee County.
- 49 (5) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the 50 Senate.
- 51 (6) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the 52 House of Representatives.
- of the appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure that the membership of the board is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of this state.



57 (e) Each member shall serve a term of five years,
58 except the initial members shall serve terms as follows:

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- (1) The member appointed by the Governor shall serve a term of one year.
  - (2) The member appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries shall serve a term of two years.
- (3) The member appointed by the county commission of the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located shall serve a term of three years.
  - (4) One member appointed by the Alabama Farmers

    Federation shall serve a term of four years and the other

    member appointed by the federation shall serve a term of five

    years, as determined by the federation at the time of the

    members' appointments.
- 71 (f) The board shall elect a chair, who shall be a 72 farmer, and a secretary from among its membership.
- 73 (g) Any vacancy on the board shall be filled by the
  74 appointing authority who appointed the vacating member. Any
  75 member may be removed for cause upon a majority vote by all
  76 other members.
  - (h) No member may have an interest, directly or indirectly, in any contract for work, materials, or services, or profits therefrom, to be performed under the authority conferred by this act if the member, directly or indirectly, has more than a 10 percent interest in any business, firm, corporation, or profits thereof, furnishing or providing the work, materials, or services.
- (i) The board may appoint an advisory council



- 85 consisting of not more than 10 members to advise the board.
- 86 Advisory-council members shall serve two-year terms and may be
- appointed to additional terms by the board.
- 88 Section 2. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center
- 89 Corporation shall have the following powers:
- 90 (1) To adopt bylaws necessary for the implementation
- 91 and administration of this act.
- 92 (2) To institute and defend legal proceedings in any
- 93 court of competent jurisdiction and proper venue; provided,
- 94 however, that the corporation may not be sued in any trial
- 95 court other than the courts of the county of incorporation;
- 96 provided, further, that the officers, directors, agents, and
- 97 employees of the corporation may not be sued for their actions
- 98 on behalf of the corporation except for actions that are
- 99 unreasonable or known by the individual to be unlawful or are
- 100 performed with reckless disregard for the lawfulness of such
- 101 actions.
- 102 (3) To plan for construction and development of the
- 103 Alabama Farm Center on property owned by the corporation.
- 104 Construction and development may include, without limitation,
- 105 any of the following:
- 106 a. Buildings to hold offices for use by, and to house
- or accommodate public facilities of, any governmental entity.
- b. Streets, boulevards, walkways, parkways, parks, or
- 109 other places of recreation.
- 110 c. Monuments, statues, or other structures beautifying
- 111 the Alabama Farm Center.
- d. Community houses, meeting houses, or auditoriums.



- e. Arenas, convention halls, sports facilities,
- 114 stadiums, hotels or other facilities for use as a transient
- 115 guest housing facility, multifamily housing, dormitory
- 116 housing, food courts or other food venue facilities, any
- facilities that provide for or support any public or private
- 118 educational institution, and any other facilities related to
- 119 or incidental to the foregoing.
- 120 f. Music halls, art museums, art exhibits, or other
- 121 exhibits for the advancement of the humanities and cultural
- 122 development.
- g. Any other buildings, structures, facilities, and
- 124 other improvements that the corporation determines are
- appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center's purposes.
- 126 The determination of the corporation shall be conclusive.
- 127 (4) To acquire property, both real and personal, and
- 128 rights and interests in such property, by gift, grant, lease,
- 129 or purchase.
- 130 (5) To accept or receive gifts, bequests, and devises.
- 131 (6) To have and use a corporate seal and alter the seal
- 132 at its pleasure.
- 133 (7) To appoint officers, agents, employees, and
- attorneys and to fix their compensation.
- 135 (8) To hire professionals and enter into contracts for
- their services in designing and supervising the construction
- of any building, agriculture center, auditorium, arena, barn,
- 138 convention hall, music hall, art museum, place of recreation,
- 139 art exhibit, office building, or other structure that it
- 140 desires to construct.



- 141 (9) To make and enter into contracts and to execute all
  142 instruments necessary or convenient to lease or purchase and
  143 own real or personal property to be used for the furtherance
  144 of the purposes for which the center is created.
- 145 (10) To plan for programs and exhibits in the center
  146 for the advancement of the agricultural, cultural, and
  147 workforce development interests of the residents of this
  148 state.
- 149 (11) To accept pledges of revenues or grants of money 150 from any person or governmental entity.
- 151 (12) To sell and lease its property to any person or 152 governmental entity.
- 153 (13) To enter into financing agreements with federal or 154 state agencies that may require the authority to mortgage its 155 property.
- 156 (14) To plan for programs and exhibits in the center
  157 for the advancement of agricultural and workforce development
  158 interests in this state.
- 159 (15) To enter into long-term contracts or agreements 160 for utility services.
- 161 (16) To accept lease payments, loan repayments, or
  162 other compensation to or for the center or other public
  163 person.
- (17) To invest in bank deposits, U.S. Treasury bills, projects, instruments, real, personal, or mixed property, or any other investments as the corporation may from time to time determine to be appropriate and convenient to accomplish any purpose for which the center is organized, including works of



169 internal improvement, interests in private or other corporate 170 enterprises, loans of money or credit to individuals, 171 associations, or other corporations; and to lend the 172 corporation's credit, grant public money or things of value in 173 aid of or to any individual, association, or other corporation 174 whatsoever, or become a stockholder in any other corporation, 175 association, or company by issuing bonds or otherwise, even 176 though they may be in violation of Section 93 or Section 94 of 177 the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, if done by the state or a subdivision thereof, notwithstanding the fact that any 178 179 investment or action may involve the expenditure or appropriation of funds received from a public person. In 180 181 particular, but not by way of limitation, the corporation may 182 invest its funds, from whatever source, in the stock, bonds, 183 debentures, notes, or other securities issued by any person 184 locating a project in this state and may enter into contracts 185 or options, including contracts or options for the conveyance, 186 sale, or lease of property, to any such person and make direct 187 grants of money, property, or services for the purpose of 188 inducing the person to locate a project in this state. 189 (18) To issue its bonds for the purpose of carrying out 190 any of its powers and to apply proceeds from the sale of its bonds, whether heretofore or hereafter issued, not only for 191 192 payment of interest thereon prior to and during the 193 construction and equipment of any buildings, structures, 194 facilities, or other improvements being financed thereby, but also for payment of interest thereon. 195

(19) To mortgage and pledge any or all of its



properties, both real and personal, or any part or parts
thereof, as security for the payment of the principal of and
the interest on any bonds so issued and any agreements made in
connection therewith, whether then owned or thereafter
acquired, and to pledge the revenues and receipts therefrom or
from any thereof.

- (b) Contracts of the corporation shall be executed in the name of the corporation by the chair of the board and attested by the secretary of the board. The board may provide by resolution for a different form for the execution of a contract by an officer or agent other than the chair and secretary. A contract, irrespective of its form and of the persons executing the contract, shall not be binding unless the contract is authorized or ratified by the board.
  - (c) The corporation may deposit its funds not needed to meet expenses or obligations in any bank or building and loan association, provided the deposit is fully insured by a federal corporation or agency of the federal government insuring deposits in financial institutions.
  - (d) In addition to all other powers at any time conferred on it by this section or otherwise by law, the corporation shall have the following powers together with all powers incidental thereto or necessary to the discharge thereof in corporate form:
  - (1) To participate: As a shareholder in any other corporation; as a joint venturer in a joint venture, whether the joint venture is to be memorialized contractually or through the formation of one or more separate business



entities; as a general or limited partner in a limited partnership or a general partnership; as a member in a nonprofit corporation or limited liability company; or as a member of any other lawful form of business organization, that may be involved in the development or operational activities of any buildings, structures, facilities, and other improvements that the corporation determines are appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center's purposes. In connection with the foregoing, the corporation may elect or appoint an individual to a governing body and enter into contracts or other agreements with other parties for the development, operation, design, marketing, maintenance, and use of any facilities upon the terms as the corporation determines are appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center.

- capital, and other debt and equity financing for the activities of any other corporation of which the corporation is a shareholder; any joint venture in which the corporation is a joint venture; any limited partnership or general partnership of which the corporation is a general or limited partnership; any nonprofit corporation in which the corporation is a member; or any other lawful form of business organization of which the corporation is a member; and to guarantee loans, issue bonds, or incur other forms of indebtedness on behalf of the corporation, joint venture, partnership, nonprofit corporation, or other business entity for such purposes.
  - (3) To create, establish, acquire, operate, or support



- subsidiaries and affiliates, either for profit or nonprofit, to assist the center in fulfilling its purposes.
- 255 (4) To create, establish, or support nonaffiliated for 256 profit or nonprofit corporations or other lawful business 257 organizations that operate and have as their purpose the 258 furtherance of the center's purposes.
- 259 (5) Without limiting the generality of the preceding 260 subdivisions, to accomplish and facilitate the creation, 261 establishment, acquisition, development, operation, or support of any subsidiary, affiliate, nonaffiliated corporation, or 262 263 other lawful business organization by means of loans of funds, leases of real or personal property, gifts and grants of 264 265 funds, or quarantees of indebtedness of the subsidiaries, 266 affiliates, and non-affiliated corporations.
- 267 (6) a. In addition to any other authority to enter into contracts, to enter into contracts, agreements, or understandings with any other public and private parties including, but not limited to, the following:

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- 1. Design-build, design-build-operate,
  design-build-own-operate, design-build-own-operate-maintain,
  design-build-finance-operate-maintain, or other similar
  arrangements or agreements pursuant to which the design,
  right-of-way acquisition, relocation of structures or
  utilities, construction, financing, ownership, management,
  maintenance, and operation, or any combination thereof of a
  project is accomplished by or on behalf of the corporation.
  - 2. Leases, licenses, franchises, concessions, or other agreements for the development, operation, management, or



undertaking of all or any part of a project of or on behalf of the corporation.

b. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, proposals under paragraph a. may be evaluated and awarded by the corporation based on qualifications of participants or best value, or both, as evaluated by procedures of the corporation and taking into consideration the best interests of the corporation. Evaluation criteria for a contract procured pursuant to the preceding sentence shall be set forth in the request for proposal for the contract. The contract may also be awarded through any existing procurement authority, proposals, or other means of procurement otherwise available to the corporation.

Section 3. (a) Subject to the conditions, qualifications, and restrictions set forth in subsection (b), the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation may borrow money from any person or governmental entity. As security for any money borrowed, together with interest thereon, and any obligations incurred or assumed, the corporation may mortgage, pledge, or otherwise transfer and convey its real, personal, and mixed property, or any part or parts thereof, whether then owned or thereafter acquired, including any franchises then owed or thereafter adopted and all or any part of any funds of the corporation. In a resolution authorizing the mortgage given to secure the payment thereof, the corporation, in addition to its other powers, shall have the power to agree with the several holders of the mortgage to make, enter, and perform covenants and agreements as to all of the following:



309 (1) The conduct, management, and maintenance of the 310 properties held by the corporation or of the activities, 311 operations, and enterprises then or thereafter conducted by 312 the corporation.

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- (2) Insurance of the properties of the corporation.
- 314 (3) Restrictions on the exercise of the powers of the 315 corporation to dispose or to limit or regulate the use of all 316 or any part of the properties of the corporation.
  - (4) The use and disposition of any monies of the corporation, including taxes payable to the corporation under any act of the Legislature and revenues derived or to be derived from the activities, operations, and enterprises of the properties of the corporation, including any part or parts theretofore constructed or acquired and any parts, extensions, replacements, or improvements thereafter constructed or acquired.
    - (5) The setting aside of the taxes payable to the corporation under any act of the Legislature or use of the revenues or the monies of the corporation or reserves and sinking funds, and the source, custody, security, regulation, application, and disposition thereof.
  - (6) The assumption or payment or discharge of any indebtedness, liens, or other claims relating to any part of the properties of the corporation or any obligations constituting, or which may constitute, a lien on the properties or any part thereof.
- 335 (7) Limitations or other evidences of indebtedness or upon the incurrence of indebtedness of the corporation.



- (b) The power vested in the corporation to pledge taxes to be paid to the corporation or to pledge revenue of the corporation shall not be construed as undertaking or purporting to empower the corporation to pledge any tax or any revenue if the pledge is prohibited by the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. It is expressly provided that the corporation shall have the power to pledge any tax paid to the corporation or revenue of the corporation, the pledge of which is authorized by the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
  - (c) The powers and authority set forth in this section shall only be exercised if necessary in order for the corporation to receive federal funding or grants for any projects or activities of the corporation.

Section 4. The county in which the Alabama Farm Center is located and each municipality therein may lease, sell, donate, or otherwise convey to the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation real or personal property, including park properties, without authorization by election of the qualified voters of the county or of the municipality; and the county in which the center is located and each municipality therein are authorized, but not required, to appropriate public funds of the county or of the municipality to the corporation to be used by the corporation for purposes of this act. The county in which the center is located shall not lease, sell, donate, or convey any property to the corporation, or appropriate any money to the corporation, unless the county commission of that county has determined that the lease, sale, donation, conveyance, or appropriation will benefit the people of that



365 county or municipality to such an extent as to fully warrant
366 and justify the lease, sale, donation, conveyance, or
367 appropriation.

Section 5. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation may permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages

any day of the week, purchased from licensees of the Alcoholic

Beverage Control Board, to be consumed by purchasers within

the boundaries of the Alabama Farm Center.

Section 6. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation and all property in which it may have any

ownership, leasehold, or other interest, direct or indirect,

is exempt from all municipal ordinances and rules, including

zoning ordinances, unless the corporation consents to the

application of ordinance or rule.

Section 7. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation, as a governmental entity, is exempt from the payment of all state, county, and municipal noneducational taxes.

(b) (1) Any county or municipal sales and use tax proceeds that are collected by the corporation; a joint venture of the corporation, including a public or private venture of the corporation; or a lessee of the corporation or a joint venture of the corporation, and remitted to a local taxing authority shall be rebated by that local taxing authority to the corporation.

(2) The county commission of the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located, at the time of the formation of the corporation, may opt-out of the requirement



- to rebate sales taxes collected by a private entity, joint venture partner, or public-private partnership.
- 395 (3) The corporation may enter into revenue sharing
  396 agreements with the county commission of the county in which
  397 the center will be located and municipalities therein to share
  398 any tax revenue generated by the corporation outside of the
  399 operational area outlined in the corporation's articles of
  400 incorporation.
- 401 (c) The corporation is exempt from paying all state, 402 county, and local ad valorem taxes.
- (d) The corporation is exempt from paying any other taxes levied by a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state, including, but not limited to, license and excise taxes imposed relating to the privilege of engaging in any activities that the corporation may engage in.
- Section 8. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

  Corporation shall be deemed an economic development

  organization, and the Alabama Farm Center shall be deemed a

  site, for the purposes of Article 19A, Chapter 18, Title 40 of

  the Code of Alabama 1975.
- Section 9. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

  Corporation shall be subject to audit and examination every

  two years by the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts

  for compliance with this act.
- Section 10. The provisions of this act are severable.


