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SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a county may establish an agriculture authority to construct and operate facilities to promote agricultural businesses, operations, commodities, workforce development, and economic development in the county.

Also under existing law, economic development organizations may receive incentives for certain projects undertaken in this state for the betterment of this state's economy.

This bill would provide for the creation of the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation to operate the Alabama Farm Center and vest the corporation with certain powers and privileges.

This bill would provide for the composition and operation of a board of directors to govern the corporation.

This bill would permit certain counties and municipalities to sell property and appropriate public funds to the corporation.

This bill would permit the corporation to allow the consumption of alcohol on the center's premises.

This bill would exempt the corporation and its property from municipal ordinances and rules.

This bill would exempt the corporation and its

31	This bill would provide that the Alabama Farm

37	TO BE ENTITLED
38	AN ACT
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40	Relating to agriculture; to authorize the creation of
41	the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation to operate the
42	Alabama Farm Center; to create and provide for the operation
43	of a board to govern the corporation; to provide specific
44	powers and privileges to the corporation; to permit certain
45	counties and municipalities to sell property and appropriate
46	public funds to the corporation; to exempt the corporation
47	from municipal ordinances; to exempt the corporation from
48	certain taxes; and to deem the Agriculture Exhibition Center
49	Corporation an economic development organization for the
50	purposes of the Growing Alabama Act.
51	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
52	Section 1. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center
53	Corporation may be established and created by any number of
54	individuals filing articles of incorporation in the office of
55	the judge of probate of the county in which the Alabama Farm
56	Center will be located.



- 57 (b) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall
 58 operate the Alabama Farm Center for the purposes of promoting,
 59 showcasing, and facilitating education regarding all facets of
 60 the agricultural industry and advancing agricultural business
 61 and workforce development in this state.
 - (c) The Alabama Farm Center shall be located on an approximately 500-acre parcel of real property located in the county having the largest population in this state according to the last federal decennial census.
 - (d) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation shall be governed by, and all powers of the corporation shall be exercised by, pursuant to the corporation's authorization, a board of directors that shall have five members appointed as follows, subject to confirmation by the Senate:
- 71 (1) One member appointed by the Governor.

- 72 (2) One member appointed by the Commissioner of 73 Agriculture and Industries.
 - (3) One member appointed by the county commission of the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located who shall be a farmer and resident of that county.
 - (4) Two members appointed by the Alabama Farmers

 Federation who shall each be a farmer. One appointee shall

 reside in any county north of or in Pickens, Tuscaloosa, Bibb,

 Shelby, Coosa, Tallapoosa, or Chambers County; and the other

 appointee shall reside in any county south of or in Sumter,

 Greene, Hale, Perry, Chilton, Elmore, Macon, or Lee County.
 - (e) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure that the membership of the board is



- inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of this state.
- 87 (f) Each member shall serve a term of five years, 88 except the initial members shall serve terms as follows:
- (1) The member appointed by the Governor shall serve a term of one year.
- 91 (2) The member appointed by the Commissioner of 92 Agriculture and Industries shall serve a term of two years.
- 93 (3) The member appointed by the county commission of 94 the county in which the Alabama Farm Center will be located 95 shall serve a term of three years.
 - (4) One member appointed by the Alabama Farmers

 Federation shall serve a term of four years and the other

 member appointed by the federation shall serve a term of five

 years, as determined by the federation at the time of the

 members' appointments.
- 101 (g) The board shall elect a chair, who shall be a 102 farmer, and a secretary from among its membership.

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- 103 (h) Any vacancy on the board shall be filled by the
 104 appointing authority who appointed the vacating member. Any
 105 member may be removed for cause upon a majority vote by all
 106 other members.
- (i) No member may have an interest, directly or
 indirectly, in any contract for work, materials, or services,
 or profits therefrom, to be performed under the authority
 conferred by this act if the member, directly or indirectly,
 has more than a 10 percent interest in any business, firm,
 corporation, or profits thereof, furnishing or providing the

- 114 (j) The board may appoint an advisory council
- 115 consisting of not more than 10 members to advise the board.
- 116 Advisory-council members shall serve two-year terms and may be
- appointed to additional terms by the board.
- 118 Section 2. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center
- 119 Corporation shall have the following powers:
- 120 (1) To adopt bylaws necessary for the implementation
- 121 and administration of this act.
- 122 (2) To institute and defend legal proceedings in any
- 123 court of competent jurisdiction and proper venue; provided,
- 124 however, that the corporation may not be sued in any trial
- 125 court other than the courts of the county of incorporation;
- 126 provided, further, that the officers, directors, agents, and
- employees of the corporation may not be sued for their actions
- 128 on behalf of the corporation except for actions that are
- 129 unreasonable or known by the individual to be unlawful or are
- performed with reckless disregard for the lawfulness of such
- 131 actions.
- 132 (3) To plan for construction and development of the
- 133 Alabama Farm Center on property owned by the corporation.
- 134 Construction and development may include, without limitation,
- any of the following:
- a. Buildings to hold offices for use by, and to house
- or accommodate public facilities of, any governmental entity.
- b. Streets, boulevards, walkways, parkways, parks, or
- 139 other places of recreation.
- 140 c. Monuments, statues, or other structures beautifying



- 141 the Alabama Farm Center.
- d. Community houses, meeting houses, or auditoriums.
- e. Arenas, convention halls, sports facilities,
- 144 stadiums, hotels or other facilities for use as a transient
- quest housing facility, multifamily housing, dormitory
- 146 housing, food courts or other food venue facilities, any
- 147 facilities that provide for or support any public or private
- 148 educational institution, and any other facilities related to
- or incidental to the foregoing.
- f. Music halls, art museums, art exhibits, or other
- 151 exhibits for the advancement of the humanities and cultural
- 152 development.
- 153 g. Any other buildings, structures, facilities, and
- 154 other improvements that the corporation determines are
- appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center's purposes.
- 156 The determination of the corporation shall be conclusive.
- 157 (4) To acquire property, both real and personal, and
- 158 rights and interests in such property, by gift, grant, lease,
- 159 or purchase.
- 160 (5) To accept or receive gifts, bequests, and devises.
- 161 (6) To have and use a corporate seal and alter the seal
- 162 at its pleasure.
- 163 (7) To appoint officers, agents, employees, and
- 164 attorneys and to fix their compensation.
- 165 (8) To hire professionals and enter into contracts for
- 166 their services in designing and supervising the construction
- of any building, agriculture center, auditorium, arena, barn,
- 168 convention hall, music hall, art museum, place of recreation,



- art exhibit, office building, or other structure that it
 desires to construct.
- 171 (9) To make and enter into contracts and to execute all
 172 instruments necessary or convenient to lease or purchase and
 173 own real or personal property to be used for the furtherance
 174 of the purposes for which the center is created.
- 175 (10) To plan for programs and exhibits in the center
 176 for the advancement of the agricultural, cultural, and
 177 workforce development interests of the residents of this
 178 state.
- 179 (11) To accept pledges of revenues or grants of money 180 from any person or governmental entity.
- 181 (12) To sell and lease its property to any person or governmental entity.
- 183 (13) To enter into financing agreements with federal or 184 state agencies that may require the authority to mortgage its 185 property.
- 186 (14) To plan for programs and exhibits in the center
 187 for the advancement of agricultural and workforce development
 188 interests in this state.
- 189 (15) To enter into long-term contracts or agreements
 190 for utility services.
- 191 (16) To accept lease payments, loan repayments, or 192 other compensation to or for the center or other public 193 person.
- 194 (17) To invest in bank deposits, U.S. Treasury bills,
 195 projects, instruments, real, personal, or mixed property, or
 196 any other investments as the corporation may from time to time

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197 determine to be appropriate and convenient to accomplish any 198 purpose for which the center is organized, including works of 199 internal improvement, interests in private or other corporate 200 enterprises, loans of money or credit to individuals, 201 associations, or other corporations; and to lend the 202 corporation's credit, grant public money or things of value in 203 aid of or to any individual, association, or other corporation 204 whatsoever, or become a stockholder in any other corporation, 205 association, or company by issuing bonds or otherwise, even though they may be in violation of Section 93 or Section 94 of 206 207 the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, if done by the state or a subdivision thereof, notwithstanding the fact that any 208 209 investment or action may involve the expenditure or 210 appropriation of funds received from a public person. In 211 particular, but not by way of limitation, the corporation may 212 invest its funds, from whatever source, in the stock, bonds, 213 debentures, notes, or other securities issued by any person 214 locating a project in this state and may enter into contracts 215 or options, including contracts or options for the conveyance, 216 sale, or lease of property, to any such person and make direct 217 grants of money, property, or services for the purpose of 218 inducing the person to locate a project in this state. 219 (18) To issue its bonds for the purpose of carrying out 220

any of its powers and to apply proceeds from the sale of its bonds, whether heretofore or hereafter issued, not only for payment of interest thereon prior to and during the construction and equipment of any buildings, structures, facilities, or other improvements being financed thereby, but

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225 also for payment of interest thereon.

- (19) To mortgage and pledge any or all of its properties, both real and personal, or any part or parts thereof, as security for the payment of the principal of and the interest on any bonds so issued and any agreements made in connection therewith, whether then owned or thereafter acquired, and to pledge the revenues and receipts therefrom or from any thereof.
- (b) Contracts of the corporation shall be executed in the name of the corporation by the chair of the board and attested by the secretary of the board. The board may provide by resolution for a different form for the execution of a contract by an officer or agent other than the chair and secretary. A contract, irrespective of its form and of the persons executing the contract, shall not be binding unless the contract is authorized or ratified by the board.
 - (c) The corporation may deposit its funds not needed to meet expenses or obligations in any bank or building and loan association, provided the deposit is fully insured by a federal corporation or agency of the federal government insuring deposits in financial institutions.
- (d) In addition to all other powers at any time conferred on it by this section or otherwise by law, the corporation shall have the following powers together with all powers incidental thereto or necessary to the discharge thereof in corporate form:
- 251 (1) To participate: As a shareholder in any other 252 corporation; as a joint venturer in a joint venture, whether

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253 the joint venture is to be memorialized contractually or 254 through the formation of one or more separate business 255 entities; as a general or limited partner in a limited 256 partnership or a general partnership; as a member in a 257 nonprofit corporation or limited liability company; or as a 258 member of any other lawful form of business organization, that 259 may be involved in the development or operational activities 260 of any buildings, structures, facilities, and other 261 improvements that the corporation determines are appropriate, 262 useful, or expedient to the center's purposes. In connection 263 with the foregoing, the corporation may elect or appoint an 264 individual to a governing body and enter into contracts or 265 other agreements with other parties for the development, 266 operation, design, marketing, maintenance, and use of any 267 facilities upon the terms as the corporation determines are 268 appropriate, useful, or expedient to the center.

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(2) To make or arrange for loans, contributions to capital, and other debt and equity financing for the activities of any other corporation of which the corporation is a shareholder; any joint venture in which the corporation is a joint venture; any limited partnership or general partnership of which the corporation is a general or limited partnership; any nonprofit corporation in which the corporation is a member; or any other lawful form of business organization of which the corporation is a member; and to guarantee loans, issue bonds, or incur other forms of indebtedness on behalf of the corporation, joint venture, partnership, nonprofit corporation, or other business entity



for such purposes.

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- 282 (3) To create, establish, acquire, operate, or support 283 subsidiaries and affiliates, either for profit or nonprofit, 284 to assist the center in fulfilling its purposes.
- 285 (4) To create, establish, or support nonaffiliated for 286 profit or nonprofit corporations or other lawful business 287 organizations that operate and have as their purpose the 288 furtherance of the center's purposes.
- 289 (5) Without limiting the generality of the preceding 290 subdivisions, to accomplish and facilitate the creation, 291 establishment, acquisition, development, operation, or support of any subsidiary, affiliate, nonaffiliated corporation, or 292 293 other lawful business organization by means of loans of funds, 294 leases of real or personal property, gifts and grants of 295 funds, or quarantees of indebtedness of the subsidiaries, 296 affiliates, and non-affiliated corporations.
 - (6) a. In addition to any other authority to enter into contracts, to enter into contracts, agreements, or understandings with any other public and private parties including, but not limited to, the following:
- 301 1. Design-build, design-build-operate, 302 design-build-own-operate, design-build-own-operate-maintain, 303 design-build-finance-operate-maintain, or other similar arrangements or agreements pursuant to which the design, 304 305 right-of-way acquisition, relocation of structures or 306 utilities, construction, financing, ownership, management, maintenance, and operation, or any combination thereof of a 307 308 project is accomplished by or on behalf of the corporation.



2. Leases, licenses, franchises, concessions, or other agreements for the development, operation, management, or undertaking of all or any part of a project of or on behalf of the corporation.

b. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, proposals under paragraph a. may be evaluated and awarded by the corporation based on qualifications of participants or best value, or both, as evaluated by procedures of the corporation and taking into consideration the best interests of the corporation. Evaluation criteria for a contract procured pursuant to the preceding sentence shall be set forth in the request for proposal for the contract. The contract may also be awarded through any existing procurement authority, proposals, or other means of procurement otherwise available to the corporation.

Section 3. (a) Subject to the conditions,
qualifications, and restrictions set forth in subsection (b),
the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation may borrow money
from any person or governmental entity. As security for any
money borrowed, together with interest thereon, and any
obligations incurred or assumed, the corporation may mortgage,
pledge, or otherwise transfer and convey its real, personal,
and mixed property, or any part or parts thereof, whether then
owned or thereafter acquired, including any franchises then
owed or thereafter adopted and all or any part of any funds of
the corporation. In a resolution authorizing the mortgage
given to secure the payment thereof, the corporation, in
addition to its other powers, shall have the power to agree



with the several holders of the mortgage to make, enter, and perform covenants and agreements as to all of the following:

- (1) The conduct, management, and maintenance of the properties held by the corporation or of the activities, operations, and enterprises then or thereafter conducted by the corporation.
 - (2) Insurance of the properties of the corporation.
- (3) Restrictions on the exercise of the powers of the corporation to dispose or to limit or regulate the use of all or any part of the properties of the corporation.
- (4) The use and disposition of any monies of the corporation, including taxes payable to the corporation under any act of the Legislature and revenues derived or to be derived from the activities, operations, and enterprises of the properties of the corporation, including any part or parts theretofore constructed or acquired and any parts, extensions, replacements, or improvements thereafter constructed or acquired.
- (5) The setting aside of the taxes payable to the corporation under any act of the Legislature or use of the revenues or the monies of the corporation or reserves and sinking funds, and the source, custody, security, regulation, application, and disposition thereof.
- (6) The assumption or payment or discharge of any indebtedness, liens, or other claims relating to any part of the properties of the corporation or any obligations constituting, or which may constitute, a lien on the properties or any part thereof.

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365 (7) Limitations or other evidences of indebtedness or upon the incurrence of indebtedness of the corporation.

- (b) The power vested in the corporation to pledge taxes to be paid to the corporation or to pledge revenue of the corporation shall not be construed as undertaking or purporting to empower the corporation to pledge any tax or any revenue if the pledge is prohibited by the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. It is expressly provided that the corporation shall have the power to pledge any tax paid to the corporation or revenue of the corporation, the pledge of which is authorized by the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
- (c) The powers and authority set forth in this section shall only be exercised if necessary in order for the corporation to receive federal funding or grants for any projects or activities of the corporation.

Section 4. The county in which the Alabama Farm Center is located and each municipality therein may lease, sell, donate, or otherwise convey to the Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation real or personal property, including park properties, without authorization by election of the qualified voters of the county or of the municipality; and the county in which the center is located and each municipality therein are authorized, but not required, to appropriate public funds of the county or of the municipality to the corporation to be used by the corporation for purposes of this act. The county in which the center is located shall not lease, sell, donate, or convey any property to the corporation, or appropriate any money to the corporation, unless the county commission of that

393	county has determined that the lease, sale, donation,
394	conveyance, or appropriation will benefit the people of that
395	county or municipality to such an extent as to fully warrant
396	and justify the lease, sale, donation, conveyance, or
397	appropriation.

Section 5. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation may permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages

any day of the week, purchased from licensees of the Alcoholic

Beverage Control Board, to be consumed by purchasers within

the boundaries of the Alabama Farm Center.

Section 6. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

Corporation and all property in which it may have any
ownership, leasehold, or other interest, direct or indirect,
is exempt from all municipal ordinances and rules, including
zoning ordinances, unless the corporation consents to the
application of ordinance or rule.

Section 7. (a) The Agriculture Exhibition Center Corporation, as a governmental entity, is exempt from the payment of all state, county, and municipal sales and use taxes. The corporation and its contractors shall be granted a certificate of exemption from sales and use taxes by the Department of Revenue as provided in Sections 40-9-14.1 and 40-9-60, Code of Alabama 1975, or other general law.

(b) (1) Any county or municipal sales and use tax proceeds that are collected by the corporation; a joint venture of the corporation, including a public or private venture of the corporation; or a lessee of the corporation or a joint venture of the corporation, and remitted to a local

- taxing authority shall be rebated by that local taxing authority to the corporation.
- 423 (2) The county commission of the county in which the
 424 Alabama Farm Center will be located, at the time of the
 425 formation of the corporation, may opt-out of the requirement
 426 to rebate sales taxes collected by a private entity, joint
 427 venture partner, or public-private partnership.
- 428 (3) The corporation may enter into revenue sharing
 429 agreements with the county commission of the county in which
 430 the center will be located and municipalities therein to share
 431 any tax revenue generated by the corporation outside of the
 432 operational area outlined in the corporation's articles of
 433 incorporation.
- 434 (c) The corporation is exempt from paying all state, 435 county, and local ad valorem taxes.

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- (d) The corporation is exempt from paying any other taxes levied by a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state, including, but not limited to, license and excise taxes imposed relating to the privilege of engaging in any activities that the corporation may engage in.
- Section 8. The Agriculture Exhibition Center

 Corporation shall be deemed an economic development

 organization, and the Alabama Farm Center shall be deemed a

 site, for the purposes of Article 19A, Chapter 18, Title 40 of

 the Code of Alabama 1975.
- Section 9. This act shall become effective immediately.
