

19	(1) Is a citizen of the United States.

23	state and federal law and has been registered to vote in the
24	county at least one year immediately prior to qualifying.
25	(4) Has been awarded a high school diploma or a GED

- (7) Has never been convicted of a felony criminal offense in this state or convicted of a criminal offense in another jurisdiction where a conviction of the offense would be considered a felony offense in this state.
- Section 3. Upon election or appointment, the sheriff of the county shall attend annually a minimum of 12 hours of executive level continuing education approved by the Alabama Sheriffs Association or the National Sheriffs' Association, or any other recognized executive level continuing education program designed for law enforcement.
- Section 4. This act shall become effective June 1, 41 2024.
