- 39 (1) A professional who is commissioned as a notary

- 41 service in exchange for a fee, commission, or other payment,
- 42 may perform any acknowledgment or other notarial act that is
- 43 required to provide the professional service; and
- 44 (2) An individual who is employed by a professional and
- 45 who is commissioned as a notary public may perform any
- 46 acknowledgment or other notarial act that is required in the
- 47 normal course of providing a professional service for which
- 48 the employing professional receives a fee, commission, or
- 49 other payment.
- 50 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 51 1, 2024.
