SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a person commits the crime of making a terrorist threat in the first degree if he or she credibly threatens to commit a crime of violence against a person or to damage any property by the use of a bomb, explosive, weapon of mass destruction, firearm, deadly weapon, or other mechanism in certain circumstances.

This bill would add to the crime a threat made against a judge or his or her staff.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the section. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective

45	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
46	Section 1. Section 13A-10-241, as created by Act
47	2023-493, 2023 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975, is
48	amended to read as follow:

50	(a) A person commits the crime of making a terrorist
51	threat in the first degree when he or she, based on an
52	objective evaluation, credibly threatens to commit a crime of
53	violence against a person or to damage any property by use of
54	a bomb, explosive, weapon of mass destruction, firearm, deadly
55	weapon, or other mechanism and any of the following occurs:
56	(1) The threat causes the evacuation of any real

- (3) The threat is with intent to retaliate against the

- c. A person who provided to a law enforcement officer,

- 77 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose
- or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of
- 79 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements
- 80 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
- 81 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
- 82 amends the definition of an existing crime.
- 83 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
- 84 1, 2024.
