4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would require that a student who
6	transfers from one public K-12 school to another shall
7	be enrolled in classes and may participate in
8	activities, including athletic activities, in the same
9	manner as all other students.
10	This bill would also prohibit public K-12
11	schools from denying, or from being a member of any
12	athletic association that denies, a student's
13	participation in an athletic activity based on when he
14	or she transferred to that school.

18	TO BE ENTITLED
19	AN ACT

21	Relating to the transfer of public K-12 students; to
22	require students who transfer from one public school to
23	another to be enrolled in classes and eligible for
24	participation in activities in the same manner as all other
25	students; and to prohibit public K-12 schools from denying,
26	and from membership in an athletic association that denies,
27	student participation in athletic events based on when they
28	transferred to the school.

SB36 INTRODUCED



29 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

30 Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the 31 following terms have the following meanings:

32 (1) ATHLETIC ACTIVITY. The same meaning as Section
33 16-30D-2, Code of Alabama 1975.

(2) SCHOOL. A public K-12 school.

35 (b)(1) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, any 36 student who transfers from one school to another shall be 37 enrolled in classes and may participate in activities, 38 including athletic activities, at the school where he or she 39 transferred in the same manner as all other students enrolled 40 at that school.

(2) No public K-12 school may deny, nor be a member of an athletic association that denies, student participation in, or eligibility for, an athletic activity at the school where the student is enrolled based on the date in which he or she transferred to that school.

46 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 47 1, 2024.
