20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the
22	term "appliance" means an item used in the home for the
23	performance of domestic chores or tasks, or used in a
24	commercial or industrial setting for the performance of
25	similar tasks, including, but not limited to, cooking, food
26	storage, heating, cooling, washing, or drying, and the term

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"governmental entity" shall have the same meaning provided in

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- 29 (b) A governmental entity may not enact or enforce any
 30 resolution, ordinance, regulation, rule, code, program, or
 31 policy, or take any other action that restricts or prohibits,
 32 or has the effect of restricting or prohibiting, any person or
 33 other entity from acquiring or using any appliance solely
 34 based on the type of energy or energy generation used to
 35 operate the appliance.
- 36 (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit 37 a governmental entity's authority to do any of the following:
- 38 (1) Regulate any entity providing energy or energy 39 generation.
- 40 (2) Prohibit the use of any household appliance for an illegal purpose.
- 42 (3) Take actions to ensure that the usage of a 43 household appliance complies with the manufacturer's 44 recommendations.
- 45 (4) Exercise existing authority to review or approve 46 applications for building permits or to otherwise enforce 47 building, fire, or other public safety codes or other 48 regulations.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2024.
