8	To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year
9	ending September 30, 2024: from the Youth Services
10	Reimbursement Fund for Diversion Programs to the Department of
11	Youth Services in the amount of \$2,243,062; from the Veterans'
12	Assistance Fund to the Department of Veterans' Affairs in the
13	amount of \$300,000; and from the State General Fund to various
14	executive, legislative, and judicial agencies and entities of
15	the state for a total amount of \$215,427,369.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations
18	heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated
19	\$2,243,062 from the Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for
20	Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services for the
21	fiscal year ending September 30, 2024.
22	Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations
23	heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated
24	\$300,000 from the Veterans' Assistance Fund to the Department
25	of Veterans' Assistance Affairs for renovations to the Alabama
26	Veterans War Memorial in Montgomery for the fiscal year ending
27	September 30, 2024.
28	Section 3. In addition to all other appropriations

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- 29 heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a
- 30 total of \$215,427,369 from the State General Fund to the
- 31 following executive, legislative, and judicial agencies and
- 32 entities of the state for the purposes specified below for the
- 33 fiscal year ending September 30, 2024:
- 34 (1) To the Legislative Services Agency, \$500,000. This
- 35 appropriation shall be used to contract with an outside entity
- 36 to conduct a comprehensive review of Alabama's current
- 37 policies and procedures governing state employment to identify
- 38 recommendations that may be taken to incorporate a modernized
- 39 approach to recruiting, retaining, compensating, and
- 40 supervising qualified candidates for state employment. The
- 41 agency shall file a report by January 1, 2026, with the
- 42 Governor and the Chairs of the Senate Committee on Finance and
- 43 Taxation General Fund and the House Ways and Means General
- 44 Fund Committee with the results and recommendations of the
- 45 study.
- 46 (2) To the Legislative Council for construction of a
- 47 parking deck related to the new State House construction,
- 48 \$20,000,000.
- 49 (3) To the Supreme Court for one-time repairs and
- 50 maintenance of the Heflin-Tolbert building and IT hardware
- 51 upgrades, \$716,600.
- 52 (4) To the Department of Commerce to be used for the
- for pier repairs for the Port of Mobile, \$5,000,000.
- 54 (5) To the Department of Corrections Correctional
- 55 Capital Improvement Fund established in Section 14-2-21(c),
- Code of Alabama 1975, for prison construction, \$150,000,000.

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- 57 (6) To the Emergency Management Agency to replace the Mobile Command vehicle, \$600,000.
- 59 (7) To the Department of Finance for the State Capitol,
- \$3,005,769. Of this amount, \$1,511,494 shall be used for
- building security upgrades, and \$1,494,275 shall be used for
- 62 repairs to include recoating exterior walls and structural
- floors.
- 64 (8) To the Geological Survey for the Core and Sample
- 65 Repository, \$3,500,000.
- 66 (9) To the State Industrial Development Authority for
- site development, \$15,000,000. The fund shall be managed and
- 68 controlled by the State Industrial Development Authority and
- 69 expended to provide grants for the assessment of and
- 70 subsequent development of sites.
- 71 (10) To the State Law Enforcement Agency for in-car
- 72 cameras, body cameras, and handheld radios, or other related
- 73 expenses, \$4,833,000.
- 74 (11) To the Department of Mental Health, \$4,000,000. Of
- 75 this amount, \$1,000,000 shall be used to keep the psychiatric
- 76 beds operational at Bullock County Hospital while the hospital
- 77 converts to the CMS Rural Emergency Hospital model; \$1,500,000
- 78 shall be used for mental health services for the Lee County
- 79 Commission; and \$1,500,000 shall be used for the East Alabama
- 80 Medical Center for psychiatric and child services.
- 81 (12) To the Department of Senior Services for the
- Medicaid Waiver Program, \$1,672,000.
- 83 (13) To the Tourism Department for a study on
- 84 establishing a statewide trails network as provided in Act





- 85 2023-378, \$1,000,000.
- 86 (14) To the Department of Transportation to develop a
- 87 statewide plan for advanced air mobility contingent upon HB176
- of the 2024 Regular Session of the Legislature being enacted,
- \$600,000.
- 90 (15) To the Department of Veterans' Affairs,
- 91 \$5,000,000. Of this amount, \$2,500,000 shall be used for the
- 92 construction of Dovetail Landing to help veterans transition
- to civilian life; and \$2,500,000 shall be used for Veterans
- 94 Recovery Resources in Mobile.
- 95 Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately.
