4 Under existing law, a child who is six years of 5 age on or before December 31 is entitled to admission 6 to the first grade in the public elementary schools, 7 and a child who is five years of age on or before 8 September 1 is entitled to admission to the local 9 public school kindergartens.

10 This bill would allow a child who becomes six 11 years of age on or before December 31, or the date on 12 which school begins, to be admitted to the first grade, 13 as long as he or she has completed kindergarten or 14 otherwise demonstrates first grade readiness.

15This bill would also provide for those16circumstances where an underage child may be admitted17to public school kindergarten.

18 Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama 19 of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or 20 effect would be to require a new or increased 21 expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with 22 regard to a local governmental entity without enactment 23 by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number 24 of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected 25 entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or 26 provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for 27 the purpose.

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The purpose or effect of this bill would be to



29	require a new or increased expenditure of local funds
30	within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill
31	does not require approval of a local governmental
32	entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective
33	because it comes within one of the specified exceptions

39	AN ACT
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41	To amend Section 16-28-4, Code of Alabama 1975,
42	relating to the minimum age for attendance at public schools;
43	to require a child to complete kindergarten or demonstrate
44	first grade readiness before entering the first grade; to
45	provide for circumstances under which a child who is under
46	five years of age on September 1 may be admitted to public
47	kindergarten; to provide for circumstances under which a child
48	who is under six years of age on December 31 may be admitted
49	to public school first grade; and in connection therewith
50	would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new
51	or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of
52	Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
53	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
54	Section 1. Section 16-28-4 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
55	is amended to read as follows:

57	(a) A child who is <mark>-six five</mark> years of age on or before
58	December 31 September 1 or the date on which school begins in
59	the enrolling district shall be entitled to admission to the
60	first grade kindergarten in the public elementary schools at
61	the opening of <u>such</u> schools for that school year or as soon as
62	practicable thereafter. A child who is under six years of age
63	on December 31 or the date on which school begins in the
64	enrolling district shall not be entitled to admission to the
65	first grade in the public elementary schools during that
66	school year; except, that an underage child who transfers from
67	the first grade of a school in another state may be admitted
68	to school upon approval of the board of education in
69	authority, and an underage child who has moved into this state
70	having completed or graduated from a mandated kindergarten
71	program in another state shall be entitled to admission to the
72	public elementary schools regardless of age. A child who
73	becomes six years of age on or before February 1 may, on
74	approval of the local board of education, be admitted at the
75	beginning of the second semester of that school year to
76	schools in school systems having semiannual promotions of
77	pupils.
78	(b) An underage child may be admitted to public
79	kindergarten on approval of the local board of education, on a
80	space available basis, in either of the following
81	circumstances:
82	(1) The underage child transfers from a public
83	kindergarten in another state.
84	(2) The child will become five years of age between



85	September 1 and December 31, and the child satisfies certain
86	criteria that the local board of education may establish for
87	underage enrollment which, if adopted, shall include the
88	successful completion of an assessment to determine
89	developmental readiness for enrollment.
90	(b)<u>(</u>c) A child who is five years of age on or before
91	September 1 or successfully completes kindergarten by the date
92	on which school begins in the enrolling district shall be
93	entitled to admission to the <u>first grade in the</u> local public
94	school _kindergartens at the opening of _such schools for that
95	school year or as soon as practicable thereafter ; a child who
96	is under five years of age on September 1 or the date on which
97	school begins in the enrolling district shall not be entitled
98	to admission to such schools during that school year; except
99	that, an underage child who transfers from the public school
100	kindergarten in another state may be admitted to local public
101	kindergarten on the prior approval of the local board of
102	education on a space available basis. The aforementioned
103	underage children transferring from the public school
104	kindergartens of another state, upon successful completion of
105	the kindergarten in the local public schools, will then be
106	allowed admission to the first grade of the local public
107	schools.
108	(d) A child who is six years of age on or before
109	December 31, or the date on which school begins in the
110	enrolling district, and who has not successfully completed
111	kindergarten, shall be entitled to admission to the first
112	grade in the local public school at the opening of schools for



113	that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter, as long
114	as the child demonstrates first grade entry readiness, as
115	determined by the State Board of Education, on an assessment
116	of essential development and physical skills which shall be
117	created by the State Department of Education and approved by
118	the State Board of Education. The department shall publish
119	information about essential first grade readiness skills on
120	its website. If a child does not meet first grade readiness,
121	as determined on the assessment approved by the State Board of
122	Education, the child shall be enrolled in kindergarten.
123	(e) An underage child, regardless of whether he or she
124	has successfully completed kindergarten or otherwise
125	demonstrates first grade readiness, may be admitted to the
126	public school first grade if the underage child transfers from
127	the first grade of a school in another state.
128	(f) Nothing in this section shall affect the
129	eligibility of students for special education services as
130	provided by federal and state law.
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131 (c) (g) No public school system shall lose any teacher 132 unit as a result of this section. The State Board of Education 133 is authorized to adopt policies for local boards of education 134 for the implementation of this section."

Section 2. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local board of education unless approved by the local board of education or
