13	TO BE ENTITLED
14	AN ACT
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16	Relating to public K-12 schools; to prohibit membership
17	in certain athletic associations; and to prohibit athletic
18	competition against certain schools.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the
21	term "athletic association" means any association of public or
22	nonpublic K-12 schools that acts as an organizing,
23	sanctioning, scheduling, or rulemaking body for
24	interscholastic athletic events in which students in this
25	state participate.
26	(b) No public K-12 school that benefits from state
27	funding may be a member of an athletic association that
28	prohibits, or discourages through the use of a communication,

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- 29 policy, procedure, ranking, or other instrument designed to
- 30 discourage, its member schools from competing or participating
- in a contest against or otherwise engaging in an athletic
- 32 event with a non-member school, including, but not limited to,
- 33 a scrimmage game, jamboree, or match.
- 34 (c) No public K-12 school may be a member of an
- 35 athletic association that unreasonably withholds its approval
- or support of another athletic association's application to
- 37 become an affiliate member of the National Federation of State
- 38 High School Associations within this state.
- 39 (d) No public K-12 school that benefits from state
- 40 funding may compete or participate in a contest against or
- 41 otherwise engage in an athletic event with a school that is
- 42 not a member of the athletic association in which the public
- 43 K-12 school is a member if the non-member school is a member
- 44 of an athletic association that does not do all of the
- 45 following:
- 46 (1) Mandate a preparticipation physical examination for
- 47 all students before they may participate in tryouts,
- 48 practices, or interscholastic athletic events.
- 49 (2) Implement a comprehensive concussion management and
- 50 return-to-play protocol that includes all of the following:
- 51 a. The dissemination of an informational sheet on the
- 52 risks of concussions to a parent or legal guardian of a
- 53 student participating in an athletic event before the program
- 54 starts.
- 55 b. The immediate removal and evaluation of a student
- 56 who shows symptoms of a concussion during an athletic event by

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- 57 a qualified health care provider.
- c. A prohibition against a student participating in an
- 59 athletic event after being diagnosed with a concussion until a
- 60 qualified health care provider medically clears the student to
- 61 return to participation.
- 62 (3) Comply with rules established by the National
- 63 Federation of State High School Associations.
- (4) Comply with the competition rules set by the
- athletic association that governs the public K-12 school.
- (5) Restrict participation in competition to
- 67 high-school athletes who are under 19 years of age on August 1
- 68 of that school year.
- 69 (6) Use only game officials who are certified through
- 70 assessments conducted in accordance with the National
- 71 Federation of State High School Associations' rules and
- 72 procedures.
- 73 (7) Comply with all other requirements under state
- laws, including, but not limited to, Chapter 30D of Title 16,
- 75 Code of Alabama 1975.
- 76 (e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to do
- 77 either of the following:
- 78 (1) Influence the membership status or governance of
- 79 nonpublic schools that are members of an athletic association
- 80 that is primarily composed of public K-12 schools.
- 81 (2) Affect the autonomy granted to nonpublic K-12
- 82 schools under the laws of this state.
- 83 Section 2. This act shall become effective on July 1,
- 84 2024.
