4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Existing law establishes Robert E. Lee's
6	birthday as a state holiday observed on the third
7	Monday in January.
8	This bill would specify that Robert E. Lee Day
9	would be observed on the second Monday in October.
10	This bill would delete duplicative language and
11	would also make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to
12	update the existing code language to current style.

19	Relating to state holidays; to amend Section 1-3-8,
20	Code of Alabama 1975; to specify that Robert E. Lee Day would
21	be observed on the second Monday in October; and to delete
22	duplicative language and make nonsubstantive, technical
23	revisions to update the existing code language to current
24	style.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
27	amended to read as follows:
28	"\$1-3-8



29	(a) The following days are official state
30	<u>holidays:Sunday, Christmas Day, </u>
31	(1) New Year's Day, January 1.
32	<u>(2)</u> Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, Robert E. Lee's
33	birthday, the third Monday in January.
34	(3) George Washington's birthday, Thomas Jefferson's
35	birthday, Presidents' Day, the third Monday in February.
36	(4) Confederate Memorial Day, the fourth Monday in
37	April.
38	(5) <u>National Memorial Day, the last Monday in May.</u>
39	(6) Jefferson Davis' birthday, the first Monday in
40	June.
41	(7) the Fourth day of July, Independence Day, July 4.
42	(8) Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
43	(9) Columbus Day, and Fraternal Day, American Heritage
44	Day, and Robert E. Lee Day, the second Monday in October.
45	(10) Veterans Day, November 11.
46	(11) Thanksgiving Day and the day after Thanksgiving,
47	the fourth Thursday in November and the following day.
48	(12) Christmas Day, December 25.
49	(b) American Indian Heritage Day, and the day
50	designated by the Governor for public thanksgiving shall each
51	be deemed a holiday. If any holiday falls on Sunday, the
52	following day is the holiday. If any holiday falls on
53	Saturday, the preceding day is the holiday. Veterans' Day
54	shall be observed by the closing of all state, county, and
55	municipal offices, all banks located within this state, and
56	the public schools on such day. Public schools, grades K to



57	12, inclusive, and all public two-year institutions of higher
58	education shall also be closed on National Memorial Day, and
59	such closing shall be applicable to all students and
60	non-essential employees.
61	(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (f), all
62	state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state
63	offices.
64	(d) The Superintendent of Banks, with the concurrence
65	of not less than two members of the state Banking Board, may
66	authorize any the closure of state bank to close on National
67	Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, banks in observance of
68	any state or federal holiday and on such any other days day as
69	may be declared by the Governor to be <u>a</u> state <u>holidays</u> <u>holiday</u>
70	or by the President of the United States to be a federal
71	<u>holiday</u> in honor of a special event. If <u>any authorized a</u> state
72	holiday falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may
73	authorize the Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday.
74	The superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at
75	12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day $_{m{ au}}$ and the day
76	prior to New Year's Day, if such days <u>the days</u> fall on
77	business days.
78	(b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays, the
79	following shall be observed on the dates herein prescribed:
80	(1) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the third Monday in
81	January.
82	(2) George Washington's birthday - the third Monday in
83	February.
84	(3) Confederate Memorial Day - the fourth Monday in

86	(4) Jefferson Davis' birthday - the first Monday in
87	June.
88	(5) Columbus Day and Fraternal Day - the second Monday
89	in October.
90	(6) Veterans' Day - the eleventh day of November.
91	(7) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday - the third
92	Monday in January.
93	(8) National Memorial Day - the last Monday in May.
94	(9) Thomas Jefferson's birthday - the third Monday in
95	February.
96	(10) American Indian Heritage Day - the second Monday
97	in October.
98	(c) (e) (1) In addition to the legal state holidays
99	provided above <u>in subsection (a)</u> , Mardi Gras shall be deemed a
100	holiday in Mobile and Baldwin Counties $_{\underline{\prime}}$ and all state offices
101	shall be closed in those counties on Mardi Gras.
102	(d) (2) In addition to the legal holidays provided
103	<pre>above all_All_state employees, except_other than those</pre>
104	employed in Baldwin and Mobile Counties $_{ au}$ shall be granted one
105	personal leave day per year. The personal leave day shall be
106	granted on January 1 of each year. All state employees
107	employed in Baldwin and Mobile Counties shall be granted no
108	personal leave day. All such personal leave days granted in
109	any year pursuant to this subdivision shall be used by the end
110	of the calendar year . All such personal leave days shall <u>and</u>
111	<u>must</u> be scheduled during the year with the approval of the
112	supervisor. Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave



113 days for employees shall justify that action in writing to the 114 Director of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay 115 at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary 116 rate of pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 117 31 of each year.

118 (c) (f) (1) All state holidays shall be observed by the 119 closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open 120 on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing 121 authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in 122 advance of the holiday. Provided, that In addition, any state 123 office may be opened in the event of an emergency, and the State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the 124 125 opening of state offices needing to be open on 126 holidays on a regular basis for essential services.

127 (2) Any state employee working on a state holiday shall 128 receive a day of compensatory leave or paid compensation in 129 lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

130 (f) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any 131 compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly 132 scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the his or her 133 supervisor, during the quarter that the regularly scheduled 134 holiday occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be 135 scheduled during the designated quarter, the compensatory 136 leave day may be accumulated at the request of the employee 137 for up to one year. Supervisors failing to schedule 138 compensatory leave days for employees within the quarter, unless the day is carried forward at the request of the 139 140 employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director



of State Personnel, and the employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled and which has not been taken.

145 (g)(1) The first day in December of each year is 146 designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All 147 citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of 148 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love, 149 and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement 150 151 on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus 152 in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is 153 requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.

154 (2) Each county and municipality may elect to observe155 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 157 1, 2024.
