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29	Section 1. Section 36-32-2, Code of Alabama 1975, is
30	amended to read as follows:
31	" §36-32-2
32	(a) The Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and
33	Education Commission shall consist of <pre>seveneight</pre> members, each
34	of whom shall be a qualified elector of the state who is over
35	the age of 18 years of age. The Professional Firefighters
36	Association of Alabama shall nominateappoint one certified
37	firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama
38	Firefighter's Association shall <pre>nominate</pre> appoint one certified
39	firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama
40	Association of Fire Chiefs shall nominate appoint one certified
41	firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama
42	Association of Volunteer Fire Departments shall
43	<pre>nominateappoint one certified volunteer firefighter to serve</pre>
4 4	for a term of four years; the Presiding Officer of the Senate
45	shall appoint one certified volunteer firefighter who is
46	experienced in the mentorship and training of aspiring
47	volunteer firefighters to serve for a term of four years; the
48	Statestate Fire Marshal or his or her designee shall serve as
49	a member; the Lieutenant Governor shall nominateappoint one
50	member; and the Governor shall <pre>nominate</pre> appoint one member of
51	the commission. The members appointed by the Lieutenant
52	Governor and the Governor shall each serve for terms of four
53	years.
54	(b) Should a vacancy occur during the term of a
55	commission member, the original nominating entityappointing
56	authority shall nominateappoint a replacement to serve for the

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57	remainder of the term. Each <pre>nominee</pre> appointee shall be
58	confirmed by the Senate before the <pre>nominee</pre> appointee becomes a
59	member of the commission. Except for the state Fire Marshall,
60	Nono commissioner who is then serving on the commission or
61	whose term has just expired shall be required to be
62	reconfirmed for a new term, once nominated by the Professional
63	Firefighters Association of Alabama, the Alabama Firefighters
64	Association, the Alabama Association of Fire Chiefs, the
65	Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments, the
66	Lieutenant Governor, or the Governor. Each member of the
67	commission shall serve until his or her successor is confirmed
68	by the Senate. If the Senate rejects the <pre>nominee</pre> appointee, the
69	nominating entityappointing authority shall make a replacement
70	nominationappointment. The nominee of the Alabama Association
71	of Fire Chiefs shall be appointed in 2013 at the expiration of
72	the term of office of the designee of the Governor whose
73	appointment ends in 2013. The nominee of the Alabama
74	Association of Volunteer Fire Departments shall be appointed
75	in 2014 at the expiration of the term of office of the
76	designee of the Governor whose appointment ends in 2014. No
77	commissioner may serve more than two consecutive terms.
78	(c) The members may adopt bylaws to govern the
79	organization of the commission, its meetings, and activities;
80	provided, that the bylaws shall not conflict with this
81	chapter.
82	(b) (d) The appointing authorities shall coordinate
83	their appointments to assure that the membership of the
84	commission shall be is inclusive and reflect reflects the
