1 2 3 4 SJR CREATING THE JOINT INTERIM STUDY COMMISSION ON 5 RESPONSIBLE TECHNOLOGY PURCHASES BY PUBLIC EDUCATION. 6 7 8 9 10 11 16

WHEREAS, technology is rapidly changing at an astonishing pace; in the past few years, staying current in the constantly changing and innovative world of technology is necessary and can be very expensive; and

WHEREAS, for our future workforce to remain 12 competitive, our public K-12 and two-year and four-year 13 institutions of higher education must keep pace academically with rapid technological change, often with limited budgets; 14 15 now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 17 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the Joint Interim Study Commission on Responsible Technology Purchases 18 by Public Education to examine the short-term and long-term 19 fiscal impact of the significant increase in mass technology 20 21 purchases and to recommend new methods of addressing any 22 potential economic, privacy, and environmental impacts of those purchases. 23

24 (a) The membership of the commission shall consist of 25 all of the following:

26 (1) The State Superintendent of Education, or his or her designee. 27

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(2) The Chancellor of the Alabama Community College



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29 System, or his or her designee. 30 (3) The Executive Director of the Alabama Commission 31 on Higher Education, or his or her designee. 32 (4) The Chair of the Senate Education Policy 33 Committee, or his or her designee. 34 (5) The Chair of the House Education Policy 35 Committee, or his or her designee. 36 (6) The Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation 37 Education Committee, or his or her designee. 38 (7) The Chair of the House Ways and Means Education Committee, or his or her designee. 39 40 (8) The Senate Minority Leader, or his or her 41 designee. 42 (9) The House of Representatives Minority Leader, or 43 his or her designee. (10) The State Finance Director, or his or her 44 45 designee. (11) An educational, hardware technology specialist 46 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. 47 (b) The designating and appointing authorities shall 48 49 coordinate their designations and appointments to assure 50 commission membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of 51 52 the state. 53 (c) The Governor shall serve as chair of the 54 commission. The commission shall meet as soon as practical 55 at a time and place set by the Governor. Notice of the meetings of the commission shall be provided in a manner 56

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57 consistent with the rules of the Legislature pertaining to 58 interim committees.

(d) In addition to reviewing the existing methods and 59 processes for mass technology purchases, the commission 60 61 shall consider the viability of establishing and implementing a model total cost of ownership (TCO) matrix or 62 63 calculator for public K-12 and higher education to utilize 64 when making large purchases of technology. In designing a simple and straightforward model template for a TCO matrix 65 66 or calculator, the commission should take into consideration all of the following factors: 67

68 (1) Residual or resale value of devices versus69 initial costs.

70 (2) Leasing and fair market value financing options.

71 (3) End-of-life device buyback options.

72 (4) Sustainability plans for future refreshes.

73 (5) Environmental impact of end-of-use disposal74 methods.

75 (6) Data privacy assurances at end-of-life.
76 (e) The Senate and the Legislative Services Agency
77 shall provide the necessary staff and support to the

78 commission to perform its duties.

(f) (1) The Legislative members of the commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the commission in accordance with Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.

84 (2) Other members of the commission may be reimbursed

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85 for necessary expenses in attending meetings of the 86 commission according to policies and procedures of their 87 respective appointing authorities.

(g) Pursuant to Section 36-14-17.1, Code of Alabama 1975, the commission shall provide to the Secretary of State a notice of all meetings, the name of each member serving on the commission, and a copy of its findings and other documents produced throughout the duration of the commission.

94 (h) The commission shall report its findings to the
95 Legislature, along with proposed legislation, and publish
96 its final report on the website of the Legislature not later
97 than January 1, 2025, at which time the commission shall
98 stand dissolved.
